## The Coming Week

This past week, Wood County Schools has been in Remote Learning, meaning students are attending classes online while at home. With Remote Learning, teachers are in contact with students during the school day and students follow a regular bell schedule for their classes. Instruction is given through a combination of online meetings, videos and Schoology assignments.

A modified re-entry plan approved by the Wood County Board of Education allows parents to choose whether students will attend four days of in-person classes with Friday being a Remote Learning day, or five days of a Remote Learning. The change will be phased in throughout November by grade level.

Elementary School students were set to return to four-day-a-week in-person classes Nov. 9, but the county was required to go fully remote due to being marked Orange on the West Virginia Department of Education Saturday Education Map. This coming Monday, Nov. 16, both elementary AND middle school students will begin four-day in-person classes, unless the district remains Orange or goes Red.

## What Color Are We Now?

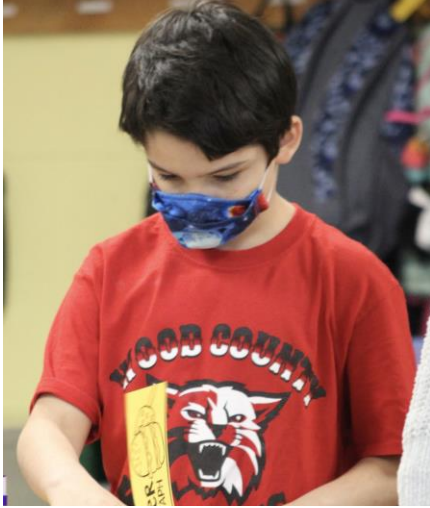
**WVDE Saturday Education Map:** If Wood County is marked **Orange** or **Red** on the Saturday map, in-person classes will be suspended and all students will learn remotely the following week. This map is updated every Saturday evening.

**WVDHHR Daily COVID Map:** If Wood County is marked **Red** on the WVDHHR daily map, all in-person classes will be suspended and all students will learn remotely until the county reaches a **Green**, **Yellow** or **Gold** designation on the Saturday map. Click the link and scroll down to the WV COVID-19 overview. At the top of the box click "County Alert System." Map is updated at 10 a.m. daily.

## Weekly COVID-19 Dashboard

Wood County Schools has created an online dashboard to report confirmed cases of COVID-19.

The page features a spreadsheet of Wood County schools and facilities. The number of positive COVID-19 cases will be listed next to each school as well as the date it was posted. The list will be reset each week.

Wood County Schools and the Mid-Ohio Valley Health Department's response to COVID cases will not change. Families will be notified of positive cases in their child's school, as will any individuals who may be asked to quarantine.
