3. SSC Intruder Door Audit. Corrective Actions that must be addressed by the GISD SSSC. Phase I.
 - a) SSSC must develop a plan to immediately train all campus staff and substitutes that all exterior doors must remain closed and locked.
 - b) Allow for staff to give feedback on how to improve school safety procedures around closing and locking exterior doors.
 - c) Training and certification to the TSSC that these actions have taken place must take place within 45 business days.
 - d) The School Board is expected to provide the public, at the next regularly scheduled board meeting, with notice that an Intruder Detection Audit was conducted by the TSSC, and a corrective action was put in place due to findings **(while not releasing any sensitive details regarding the audit in open session.)**
 - e) SSSC minutes must reflect that this finding was reported and discussed. Also document the date and time the training will occur on the campus.
4. TSSC Intruder Door Audit. Corrective Actions that must be approved by the GISD SSSC. Phase III.
 - a) SSSC must develop a plan to immediately train all campus staff and substitutes that all exterior doors must remain closed and locked.
 - b) Allow for staff to give feedback on how to improve school safety procedures around closing and locking exterior doors.
 - c) Training and certification to the TSSC that these actions have taken place must take place within 45 business days.
 - d) The School Board is expected to provide the public, at the next regularly scheduled board meeting, with notice that an Intruder Detection Audit was conducted by the TSSC, and a corrective action was put in place due to findings **(while not releasing any sensitive details regarding the audit in open session.)**
 - e) SSSC minutes must reflect that this finding was reported and discussed. Also document the day and time the training on the campus.
