
The year is rapidly moving forward, and we've already made it to October!

5TH GRADE MATH



homework!! We appreciate your support in your child's learning. If your child is still unsure of their math facts, that is a great task for your continued support. Find math games, online fact games, flash cards, skip counting, and/or songs to help your child memorize their facts. As we are learning new mathematical procedures and material, some students are struggling with correct fact knowledge and therefore unable to fully focus on the new material of fifth grade.

5TH GRADE LANGUAGE ARTS AND READING

We have been continuing our work with Parts of Speech and writing in complete sentences. We will soon begin a narrative writing. Students will get to pick from a list of Halloween writing prompts to create their own story. Figurative language has been our focus in reading. Ask your student what the difference is between a simile and a metaphor. Students have also been working on looking back into a text to find text evidence.

5TH GRADE SCIENCE AND SOCIAL STUDIES

Science: Students will continue focusing on our life science unit through the month. They will be able to understand that in ecosystems, matter and energy are transferred from one form to another. Nutrients and living matter are passed from producers (plants) to consumers (animals), then broken down by decomposers. We will continue to use Mystery Science and Project Lead the Way as resources for instruction.

Social Studies: Students will be focusing on our westward expansion unit throughout the month. They will understand how the physical characteristics of land presented many challenges and opportunities to settlers during westward expansion. They will also examine interactions and conflict among different groups of people, mainly Native Americans and settlers during the expansion of The United States.

Social Studies: Mr. Effan and Mr. Slaughter


Social Studies is talking about prehistoric humans and starting to get into our first full-on civilization Mesopotamia.

COUNSELOR'S CORNER~MS. DIAMOND

Last month I facilitated a guidance classroom lesson with both 5th and 6th graders focusing on reducing bullying behaviors with inclusion and acceptance of others. In our discussion we reviewed our district policy, effects of bullying, types of bullying and bystander "witness" responsibility. We also spoke about ways to help stop bullying when they see or hear bullying and the power in numbers. Students practiced ways to decrease unacceptable behavior through kindness and inclusion, asking classmates to stop unacceptable behaviors, reporting and the use of our district bullying report form. I encouraged all students to let us know if they are being bullied so we can help resolve any on-going issues. Pacific Intermediate wants all students to feel like they belong and are safe at school. Additionally, 6th grade students were able to participate in a "Kid's Rights - Internet Safety" lesson last month which focused on teaching them to keep safe on and offline. They learned about privacy, digital footprint, and how once things are posted they cannot be taken back.

Since October is Red Ribbon Month, our guidance lesson will focus on the negative consequences drugs can have on your life, ways to avoid peer pressure and make effective decisions to keep students safe. We will be celebrating Red Ribbon Week in many ways including a student art or essay contest: "Why I Elect to Be Drug Free." Contest winners will be able to read their essays or tips to stay off drugs in the morning announcements. Additionally, students will also be given the opportunity to pledge to be drug free and proudly display their pledge cards to classmates. Finally, we will celebrate Red Ribbon Spirit Dress Up Days, October 25th - 31st. On Halloween, students will be allowed to wear school appropriate Halloween outfits. Please note, students are not allowed to wear face paint or masks at school.







