ALBERT J. BIGELOW MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP \$500

A five hundred dollar (\$500) scholarship will be awarded in June to a member of Pioneer High School's graduating class. This is in memory of Mr. Albert J. Bigelow, a teacher in our school district for 26 years and a teacher at Pioneer High School for 19 years.

Mr. Bigelow was particularly interested that this scholarship gives financial assistance to a student who plans to pursue a career in music. Preference will be given to students pursuing a career in instrumental music. If a student has a special musical talent, this will be given consideration.

To be eligible for consideration for this scholarship, the following criteria must be met:

- Attendance at the Pioneer High School for at least one year.
- 2. An academic seven-semester grade average of 85% or better.
- Evidence of a dedication to music and the betterment of the whole high school band program. Responsibility, attitude, citizenship, and team leadership in the band program are necessary for this scholarship.
- Participation in a performing music group for at least three out of four years during your high school career.
- Evidence of good school citizenship as determined by:
 - a). Participation in at least one school club, co- or extra-curricular activity.
 - b). A positive rating by teachers and administrators as an active and positive influence in classes and the school.
- Demonstration of financial need will be seriously considered, if other criteria are met.
- Graduation from Pioneer High School.
- 8. Acceptance at an accredited four-year college/university for the study of music. Preference will be given to those attending Ithaca College.
- 9. Completion of an application and a written essay.
- 10. Possible interview by the selection committee. A screening and selection committee will be composed of:
- a). A high school administrator b). A high school guidance counselor c). Two music teachers, one of whom will be the dept. chair.

The actual five hundred (\$500) dollars will be given to the college/university of attendance when the student:

- a). Completes two years of study
- b). Presents an official college transcript of grades to the Pioneer District Office.
- c). Shows evidence of continued registration in the school of choice for a third year of study.

COMMUNITY WELLNESS AWARD-ARCADE \$300

Programs must be related to the field of Health & Wellness

A three hundred (\$300) dollar award will be granted in June to a member of Pioneer High School's graduating class to further their education in a field of Health & Wellness. The money is being sponsored by the Arcade Area Chamber of Commerce in honor of our commitment to a healthy and happy community for many years to come.

To be eligible for this award, the following criteria must be met:

- *Graduation from Pioneer High School

The recipient will be chosen by the Arcade Area Chamber of Commerce.

THE CRAIG REITMEIER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP 3/\$2000

Mr. Reitmeier wished to help children who are unable to attend college due to financial need. He was a hard worker with a warm smile. He was also a truck driver and a former owner of the Chaffee Hotel who had no children of his own.

Three (3) two thousand-dollar (\$2,000) scholarships are available to graduates who demonstrate good manners, strong work ethic, positive attitude, and respect toward others. These scholarships are available to three (3) seniors planning to pursue a degree at any college, university or trade school.

Eligibility:

- *Essay: Please describe your reason for applying for this scholarship and/or any extenuating circumstances or financial needs that you may have.
- *Complete the General Scholarship Application
- *3 Letters of Recommendation
- *75 GPA minimum

To qualify for payment, the recipients should bring a transcript to the Pioneer Central School District Office after completion of the first semester. Students will earn \$1,000 1st semester and \$1,000 2nd semester.

THE CRAIG SCHENK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP \$500

The Craig Schenk Memorial Scholarship will be presented by the Schenk family in memory of their son, Craig. Craig is remembered by his family and friends as lovable, easy-going, sweet, sincere and caring. He liked to keep things simple and slow paced. Craig was passionate about agriculture. Applicants should also have a similar passion for agriculture.

Applicants should be planning to:

- * Pursue a degree/career in the agriculture field
- * Complete the General Scholarship Application
- * Attach 3 Letters of Recommendation
- * Attach a composed essay describing his/her passion for agriculture and career intentions.

This scholarship is a one-time allocation. The Schenk family will choose the recipient and present him/her with the scholarship at the Pioneer High School Achievement Night in June.

To qualify for payment, the recipient should submit a copy of his/her first year's passing grades directly to the Schenk family prior to July preceding their sophomore year. The \$500 scholarship will then be made directly to the University in the recipient's name for their second year of college.

CRAWFORD SCHOLARSHIP \$500

This scholarship was created several years ago by George and Faith Crawford as a tribute to Pioneer Central School. The Crawfords moved to Delevan in 1954 when he became the supervising principal at Delevan-Machias Central School. He then served as the first Superintendent of Pioneer Central School from 1966 until his retirement in 1972. Our high school auditorium was named the George C. Crawford Auditorium in his honor during the 35th anniversary celebration of the school district in 2001. Mr. Crawford died in June 2003.

To be eligible for consideration, the following criteria will be used to select a senior at Pioneer Central High School:

- 1) Demonstration of community involvement and good citizenship
- 2) A cooperative student who demonstrates good school citizenship
- 3) General Scholarship Application
- 4) 3 Letters of Recommendation
- 5) Cumulative average (GPA) of 80 or above
- 6) A screening and selection committee will be composed of:
 - * A high school administrator
 - * A high school guidance counselor
 - * A high school teacher
 - * A Board of Education member

 - a) A good disciplinary record while in school. b) A good community citizenship.
- 4. Demonstration of leadership in high school activities as determined by:
 - a). Participation in at least one school club, co- or extra-curricular activity.
 - b). Recommendations from teachers and/or administrators as an active and positive influence in class and school.
- 5. A completed application form which will include a written essay by the applicant must be handed in.
- 6. Graduation from Pioneer High School.
- 7. Acceptance at an accredited school of higher learning beyond the high school level.
- 8. A screening and selection committee will be composed of:
 - * A high school administrator * A high school guidance counselor * A high school teacher * A Board of Education Member
- 9. The actual scholarship money will be awarded when the student(s) has:
 - a). Completed the first year of study.
 - b). Present an official school transcript of grades to the Pioneer District Office.
 - c). Show evidence of continued registration in the institution of learning or completion of studies and receipt of a degree, certificate, or license.

Miss Howell felt very strongly that education beyond the high school years was important for success in our world. She also wanted her money to go to "students who might not, or could not, attend an institution of higher learning if they did not receive financial assistance."

Elmer, a lifelong resident of the town of Eagle, built and ran his own business and believed in the efforts of our dedicated firemen. This scholarship rewards a Junior Fireman who is a member of a local fire department for their dedicated service to the community.

Eligibility:

- 1) Nonspecific program or field.
- 2) Must be a graduate of Pioneer Central School. Eligible applicants should be a Junior Fireman or child / dependent of an active fireman in a local department.
- 3) This scholarship generally applies to a 2/4 year college, Technical or Trade program.
- 4) Payment is made after successfully completing the 2nd year of a 4-year program, 1st year of a 2- year program, or completion and graduation of a 1-year or shorter program.
- 5) Applicant must provide proof of a "C" average or GPA of 2.0 for payment at the appropriate time interval as well as a copy of his / her semester grades at the end of each school year.
- 6) Applicant must be enrolled in a program no later than 2 years after high school graduation.
- 7) Applicant must have 1 recommendation from their fire chief, assistant or officer of the department and 1 recommendation from a faculty member of your present school.

THE GRAVES AGRICULTURAL AWARD \$200

Presented in memory of June Graves Randall and Carl L. Graves

June G. Randall and Carl Graves both graduated from Arcade Central School. They grew up on the homestead farm in Java. Carl took over the farm from his father and continued to farm the ground until his death in 1994. His love of farming was apparent to all that knew him. His passion was doing the field work and making maple syrup. During the 70 years that he lived, his greatest joy came from being outside and watching his farm endure. Aunt June shared the same passion as her younger brother. After attending Bryant and Stratton, she went to work at Agway in Perry where she met her future husband Burdette Randall. Together they ran their farm Silver Springs. Aunt June's passion was working with the animals. Her favorite was the chickens and cats. Up until her late seventy's and early eighty's she continued raising her chickens and having an egg route. Both Aunt June and Dad (Carl) set the example of finding love and making it part of their everyday life.

Our hope in presenting this award is to find a student that is choosing farming as a lifelong love not a source of income alone. The \$200 award is to be presented to a student that has a PASSION for the field of agriculture.

HARVEY MASON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP \$1000

A \$1,000 scholarship in memory of Harvey L. Mason will be awarded to a member of the graduating class planning to **pursue advanced study in the building trades or a closely related field**

To be eligible for consideration, the following criteria will be used to select a male or female recipient:

- * Have attended Pioneer High School for at least one year.
- * Be eligible to graduate from high school this spring.
- * Have demonstrated an interest in and aptitude for a career in the building trades or a closely-related career.
- * Have been accepted at an accredited college that grants either an associate's degree or a one-year certificate in the building trades or a related field of study.

Following completion of a semester of full-time study with a GPA of 2.0 or C, the recipient shall provide the school business office with a transcript prior to receiving a \$500 check. Following completion of one year of full-time study with a GPA of 2.0 or C, the recipient will receive the remaining \$500 upon submitting another transcript to the business office.

HOW TO APPLY:

- * Complete a General Scholarship Application and indicate you are applying for the Harvey Mason Memorial Scholarship.
- * Attach a typed essay of no more than 200 words describing how you became interested in the building trades and how you have demonstrated that interest so far in your life.
- * At the end of your essay, add the following statement: "If selected to receive this scholarship, I understand I will receive half of the money after I have successfully completed a semester of college and the other half of the money after I successfully completed a year of college." PIONEER FACULTY ASSOCIATION SCHOLARSHIPS (Amount varies)

These scholarships are awarded annually by the Pioneer Faculty Association. Money for these scholarships comes primarily from the union dues and other contributions paid by PFA members. Applications are reviewed by a committee made up of members from the PPA who then will select the finalist. Winners of the PPA Scholarships will be announced in June.
