### Reconfirmation Meeting for November 16, 2020

#### Review Weekly 2-Way Interaction Rates (75%)

**Document Public Comments:** We are currently surveying high school students/families regarding their desire to have their student learn at school on their virtual days. Parents/Guardians may give input during Public Participation.

#### Reconfirm instructional delivery method:

In the Preparedness and Response Plan we stated we would review the Covid data and success of our daily programming to determine increasing the number of face to face days. For elementary students we had hoped the numbers would support returning full face to face sooner. For secondary students we felt it would need to wait until the end of the first marking period, November 6, 2020. We continue to review what hurdles exist that we can overcome to go full face to face by the end of second semester. This is highly dependent on what happens with the community spread of the virus.

As of today, due to the EO from the MDHHS, High Schools must go to virtual learning beginning Wednesday, 11/18 - December 8. PreK-8 is a local decision.

Our recommendation is to have PreK-7th grade (Gold Cohort) return to in person learning this Thursday (11/19) and Friday (11/20). The Enhancement Center will be open for the Cardinal Cohort.

For the week of Thanksgiving & the following week:

- PreK-7th grades will learn 100 % virtually on Monday, November 23rd & Tuesday November 24th, as well as the week after Thanksgiving, November 30th - December 4th.
- Daycare will be available to families through the shutdown.
- 8-12th grades will continue learning virtually through December 8th.

PreK-7th grades will return to hybrid learning on December 7th, and 8-12th grades on December 10th.

**Reconfirm how instruction will be delivered to each grade level:**

**Pre-Kindergarten:**

Four full days per week. (Virtual November 23 - December 4)

**Primary School (Grades K-3):**

Hybrid, G-A Virtual K-3, KVIC (Virtual November 23 - December 4)

**Middle School (Grades 4-7):**

Hybrid and KVIC (Virtual November 23 - December 4)

**High School (Grades 8-12):**

Hybrid and KVIC, allowing some students to be in school on their virtual days. (Wednesdays will remain virtual.) (Virtual November 16 - December 8)

**Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:**

Students who are struggling and qualify for Title I services and special educational services at the Primary School are receiving additional small group instruction via zoom on Wednesdays. Currently staff have worked to develop student schedules that will provide FAPE to all of our special education students. Those services are being provided both in person and virtually. Students with disabilities and other special populations may struggle with working independently, following through on an assignment, and attending to tasks on their virtual days. They need hands and interaction with peers and staff. Our special education staff are currently reviewing data to determine which students from their caseloads would benefit from a four day week of face to face instruction. This is our first step in finding ways that will allow us to bring these special populations to school for more face to face instruction

During the shutdown, we will seek to provide one on one support services for those who can be supported. Those details will need to be worked out.
