**Reconfirmation Meeting for November**

<b>Reconfirm instructional delivery method:</b>
K-8 Student/Families have choice of 4 days face-to-face and 1 day full remote Or full remote. Per the executive order issued November 15, 2020 9-12 grade students must attend fully remote.
<b>Reconfirm how instruction will be delivered for each grade level: (No change from October)</b>
Pre-Kindergarten: (Kindergarten for Pentwater) <b>Four days Face-to-Face one day Remote.</b>
Elementary (Grades K - 5): <b>Four days Face-to-Face one day Remote.</b>
Middle School (Grades 6 - 8): <b>Four days Face-to-Face one day Remote.</b>
High School (Grades 9 - 12): <b>Full Remote 5 days per New Executive Order through December 8, 2020</b>
<b>Reconfirm whether or not the district is offering higher levels of in-person instruction for English language learners, special education students, or other special populations:</b>
<b>For students on 9-12 grade who are remote, special education service will be made available per special educations team and/or parent request.</b>
<b>Document Public Comments: (90 respondents to survey)</b>
97% of families surveyed stated that the format we are using is working well or working but could be, but could be better. 2.2% (2 out of 90) said not working at all. Those who stated not working at all or what could be done better stated (5 comments): <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● Percent positive locally is above 5 percent. Hospitals are almost at capacity. In my opinion, we are getting to the point where face to face is not safe anymore.</li> <li>● they need to go back 5 full days</li> <li>● Kids should not be in school at all. You are endangering the community.</li> <li>● 5 days a week would be better</li> <li>● Have them be in school on Wednesdays</li> </ul> <b>Other Feedback and information provided (26 respondents):</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● If anything we should be going back to two days a week because of our COVID numbers in Oceana County</li> </ul>

- Percent positive locally is above 5 percent. Hospitals are almost at capacity. In my opinion, we are getting to the point where face to face is not safe anymore.
- I'm concerned with the rising crowded numbers about the children attending face-to-face and wonder what precautions are being taken if they continue to rise.
- I think that the teachers should try to enforce mask wearing more because of the rising of the Covid-19 cases.
- Just because our school has been lucky enough to not have any "reported" COVID cases does not mean we should feel we are in the clear and move on to 5 days of face to face. The holidays are approaching and unfortunately many people will be gathering Indoors with people outside of their household and it "circle." I would not be surprised to see a large increase in positive COVID case from thanks giving through New Years.
- Thank you for keeping our children safe!
- I think that this current format of 4 days is working great and a very smart plan during this uncertain time. Pentwater has smaller class sizes already limiting the amount of exposure and the break in the middle for cleaning with the Google meets learning is working well for our family!! Thank you.
- We are very happy that you are offering the virtual option so we don't have to worry about the kids seeing their grandmother.
- My student, Aiden Shotwell, is enjoying the remote format.
- Things are much better now than they were a month ago!
- COVID cases are spiking again in our region. In the next 24 hours, Oceana county will likely be determined "dangerous/red" for transmission. What is the school's plan in the event COVID does expand to our community?
- As a teacher in this district, I want to keep Wednesdays without students in the school. If we are to be teaching full time in school and online, it is only reasonable to have a day for cleaning and meeting with virtual kids.. If we remove Wednesdays as work days and contact day to 5 days a week in school, I would want the district to buy a online platform for all of the 100 percent virtual kids. managing, prepping and posting both coupled with the amount of documentation and communication would be way to much without Wednesdays.
- With cases rising across the country there will inevitably be a case in our school. You are endangering the community to appease the ignorant.
- I think going back to 5 days a week is fine.
- I agree with Wednesday as a remote day as it gives our teachers time to prep for their remote learners, but going fully remote will negatively impact our students.
- I am happy with and proud of Pentwater for how everything has been done. I feel like it has been smart and safe for our kids and the staff. Thank you for all that you do for our kids!!
- Would love to go back 5-day in person learning!
- Please enforce mask wearing "correctly" due to increased cases in the community.
- We would like the school to police the compliance of mask wearing and social distancing with the background of higher COVID-19 cases.
- The hybrid model worked best with the 4 day model kids are sitting too close together 😊
- It is concerning to me that Covid numbers are increasing rapidly so early in the season. I believe the health & safety of staff and students should come before all else.
- We appreciate the surveys. It shows the school is actively listening to concerns.
- Also, we want to say thank you to all staff for everything they have done to make sure our children receive their education and receive it safely.
- Thank you for allowing the students return for 4 days it has helped tremendously with my kids actually learning something. I like the format would like the fully remote day to be Friday just for scheduling purposes but I understand the logic behind keeping Wednesday.

- My kids need to catch up in school and it turns out Mom is NOT the best answer. There is far more frustration then there should be and the emotional aspect is difficult.

- If there was a way to install plexiglass so the students can take off masks while at their space, it would be easier? (From Izzy) Going to lockers would hurt my back less (Highschool) her bag is so heavy.
- If we have to go all remote, having certain times to log in/off would be helpful. Log in 3-4 times a day to make sure on task. But times to log off to get work done would be helpful. Stagger them for el & upper class men for internet upload speeds.
- Lucy Macher had worked in the entire class wonderfully. Weather they are virtual or in class. Even if she couldn't see the kids papers, she included them in the lessons. Carrie Jerusal was on top of the communication. Emails to parents and students on when and how to log in virtually, when tasks were to be completed, and if you were ahead, she was helpful with what to do next.
- We appreciate all the staff and team has created to make a safe environment for our children!!
- Wednesday off are a very helpful rest and reset day with our own home COVID procedures. I think that it also keeps my child well rested to ensure that if she became sick, she would be better able to handle it. I very much appreciate this "off" day despite the fact that we both work full-time.
- Please enforce masks over the nose at all times and hand sanitizer by the lunch room doors
