Regents' Scholarship

REGENTS' SCHOLARSHIP RULES AND REQUIREMENTS

FOR 2021 GRADUATES

Working hard in high school and taking the right classes is the best way to make sure you'll be successful in college. And with the Regents' Scholarship, your early preparation can literally pay off!

Please read thoroughly, as there are changes to the scholarship requirements which affect students graduating high school in 2021.

REQUIREMENTS

ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- ▼ Take the required classes in grades 9-12 (see pages 4-8)
- ▼ Earn at least a 3.3 cumulative high school GPA
- ✓ Earn at least a composite score of 22 on the ACT
- Graduate from a Utah high school
- Meet college enrollment or deferment requirements

NON-ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

- ✓ Fill out the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid)
- Meet all deadlines
- ▼ Be a US citizen or a non-citizen eligible for federal financial aid

Regents' Scholarship recipients earn a degree at double the rate of their peers.

REQUIRED CREDITS TO BE COMPLETED IN GRADES 9-12

- 4 credits of English
- 4 credits of Math
 (at least 1 class must be selected from the advanced course list; see page 5)
- 3 credits of Social Science
- 3 credits of lab-based Science (one each of Biology, Chemistry, and Physics)
- 2 credits of the same World Language (other than English)

APPLYING FOR REGENTS' SCHOLARSHIP

You will apply for the Regents' Scholarship during your senior year. The application opens mid-November and is due no later than February 1. A priority deadline may be established each year. Additional details about the application process will be available on RegentsScholarship.org.

DIVISION I ACADEMIC REQUIREMENTS

College-bound student-athletes will need to meet the following academic requirements to practice, receive athletics scholarships, and/or compete during their first year.

Core-Course Requirement

Complete 16 core courses in the following areas:

Full Qualifier

- Complete 16 core courses.
 - Ten of the 16 core courses must be completed before the seventh semester (senior year) of high school.
 - Seven of the 10 core courses must be in English, math or natural/physical science.
- Earn a core-course GPA of at least 2.300.
- Earn the ACT/SAT score matching your core-course GPA on the Division I sliding scale (see back page).
- Graduate high school.

Academic Redshirt

- Complete 16 core courses.
- Earn a core-course GPA of at least 2.000.
- Earn the ACT/SAT score matching your core-course GPA on the Division I sliding scale (see back page).
- Graduate high school.

Full Qualifier:

College-bound student-athletes may practice, compete and receive athletics scholarships during their first year of enrollment at an NCAA Division I school.

Academic Redshirt:

College-bound student-athletes may receive athletics scholarships during their first year of enrollment and may practice during their first regular academic term, but may NOT compete during their first year of enrollment.

Nonqualifier:

College-bound student-athletes cannot practice, receive athletics scholarships or compete during their first year of enrollment at an NCAA Division I school.

Earning College Credit In High School





Many SSHS Students will choose to earn some college credit while in high school. There are several different ways to get a little college work done while you're still a SSHS student.

Advanced Placement (AP) Classes:

AP classes are college level courses taught in a high school classroom by a SSHS teacher. These classes are among the most rigorous offered at SSHS. Toward the end of the school year AP students will take the AP test. *Only students who pass the AP test will receive college credit.* You will receive high school credit based on the grade you earn in the class. Every college sets their own standards for how they accept AP credit, so it is important to check with the college you plan on attending to see how your AP credit will transfer.

UVU Concurrent Enrollment Classes (CE):

Concurrent enrollment classes are UVU college classes taught here at SSHS by one of our high school teachers. Students who follow the proper protocol and sign up with UVU to earn the concurrent credit will earn college credit for successfully completing the class. (There is no high stakes test at the end to determine if you actually earn the college credit.)

UVU Live Interactive (LI) Classes:

Live Interactive classes are UVU classes, taught by a UVU professor, on the UVU schedule, and broadcast virtually to our LI classrooms located in the district office. Many of these classes are *general education* classes. Because they run on UVU's schedule they can be a challenge to fit into a student's schedule. For this reason, you should be a junior before taking these classes and can't be behind on your progress toward graduation. There are also GPA requirements to take these classes. Speak with your counselor for details.

Mountainland Technical College (MTECH):

Students at SSHS have the opportunity to earn a work-ready certificate from MTECH during their Senior year. Some MTECH programs are offered right here at SSHS like Machining and CNA. Some programs are offered at the MTECH campus in Heber. This is a great way to be work-ready right out of high school.

Interested in UVU Live Interactive Classes?

You'll need this information so you can register starting Mid-April!



You have shown an interest in taking UVU Live Interactive Classes. Just requesting the class at your CCR does not save you a spot in that class. You still need to register for that class through UVU in order to secure a spot in the class. If you do not register with UVU you will not be able to enroll in the class you requested and your schedule will need to be changed.

Step #1: Complete the UVU admission process 24 to 48 hours <u>before</u> registering for your class (if you are already admitted skip to step 2.)

Go to uvu.edu/concurrent

- click on "Admissions"
- Click on "Admissions Application Portal"
- Complete the steps to becoming a UVU Concurrent Student

Admissions requires a one-time payment of \$35 and can be paid by credit/debit card. Applications may take up to two business days to process before you receive your UVID number and can register for your courses. Confirmation of your acceptance to UVU will be e-mailed to you.

Step #2: Get Registered for your classes as soon as registration opens!

- Click on "My UVU" (top left corner)
- Click on "Sign In"
- Log into your account using your UVID # and password
- Click on the "Students" tab in the left hand column
- Click on "Registration and Planning"
- Click on "Add Drop Classes"
- Select term "Fall 2021"
- Click "Submit"
- Register by entering the CRN #

All SSHS Juniors will be able to take the ACT in school for free in March. We recommend you take it at least twice and encourage you to take it in April or June. You'll need to sign up with ACT if you choose to take any time other than with the school in March.

- 2. Most colleges use the ACT as a criteria for **ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS**
- 3. Colleges use the ACT when determining FRESHMAN CLASS PLACEMENT





To View Your Graduation Progress:

- 1. Login to PowerSchool
- 2. From the menu on the left, choose "Class Registration"
- 3. Near the top of the screen, click on "View Graduation Progress"



- The dark green bars show you classes you have completed.
- The light green bars show you classes you are currently taking.
- The white bars are classes you still must enroll in before you can graduate.
