COLD, FLU or COVID-19?

All are respiratory illnesses caused by different viruses and **none can be treated with antibiotics.** Here's what sets them apart:



- Develops slowly and hangs around
- Coughing & sneezing
- No fever or low-grade fever
- Sore throat
- > Stuffy, runny nose
- Vomiting & diarrhea are not common symptoms of a cold
- Treated with over-the-counter meds



- Develops quickly
- Coughing
- 100°-102° fever (higher in kids)
- Chest congestion and discomfort
- Headaches, body aches, pains and chills
- Sore throat and runny or stuffy nose
- Vomiting & diarrhea (more common in children)
- * Treated with anti-viral meds



Anyone can have mild to severe symptoms. Symptoms may appear 2-14 days after exposure to the virus.

- Fever or chills
- Coughing
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue (tiredness)
- Sore throat
- Runny or stuffy nose
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Nausea or vomiting and diarrhea (more common in children)

BEST DEFENSE

- Wash your hands often and with soap and water for 20 seconds
- Avoid close contact stay at least 6 feet apart
- Cover coughs and sneezes with the inside of your elbow or tissue

- Cover your mouth and nose with a mask when around others
- Clean and disinfect surfaces frequently
- Monitor your health daily and stay away from others when ill
