Stay home from work, school and errands when you are sick. You will help prevent others from catching your illness. Avoid close contact with people who are sick.

Please be sure to contact the school nurse with any symptoms or diagnosis of illness.

Due to COVID-19, all persons in the schools are required to adhere to a number of measures to comply with the public health guidelines. These include, but are not limited to: staying at home when ill, washing hands often, wearing masks/face coverings (no gaiters or vented masks) and maintaining social distance.

## How we can prevent the spread of germs

 Washing your HANDS often with soap and water or an alcohol based hand sanitizer for 20 seconds. Washing hands often under clean, running water can help prevent the spread of germs. For more guidance see the <u>CDC</u>: When and How to Wash Your Hands. If you cannot wash your hands, use alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60-95% alcohol.

- Wearing a MASK Wearing a cloth or paper surgical mask can help prevent the spread of germs.
- Per the Medfield Board of Health, no gaiters or masks with valves or vents
- **Keeping your DISTANCE** Keeping a distance of at least 6 feet between others helps reduce the spread of germs.
