**New Person to the Team:** We're not sure yet who will be joining us! Stay tuned for more information.






# What to expect on Day 1:

Sixth graders will be joining the team on August 31 for a few minutes. Their first day back is really intended to get to know their advisee groups and get a feel for our school. Students should dress in comfortable attire, knowing that some activities may get their clothes dirty. Seventh and Eighth graders are NOT expected to attend school that day.

Our team will be together for the first time on Thursday, September 1. Our plan has the whole team together, outside, for introductions, get to know you activities, and a few other activities. Students will want to dress comfortably and in clothes that can get dirty! While you will not need your school supplies on this day, you are expected to read. **BRING A BOOK WITH YOU, ALWAYS.** 



Friday, September 2 will consist of similar activities, goal setting, and you guessed it: Reading. Students should again dress comfortably and in clothing that can get dirty. Our academic classes will be starting this day.

Changes for 2022-2023: There will be no specific COVID protocols. Desks can now be in groups and we'll be able to interact with one another more closely.

## What to expect throughout the year:

While classes will still happen indoors, we will take advantage of being outside as much as possible. We encourage your students to come dressed and prepared with a sweatshirt or some other layer. We may be on wet grass so no one should wear shoes or anything else that they don't want to get wet. Our outdoor classrooms will even be used on the first day of school.



Our team has woven Social and Emotional Learning and Mindfulness into our day. We are going to keep doing so. With all the changes and stressors we think those skills are more important than ever. Students will be using reading as a way to reboot, writing as a way to reflect, and mindfulness as a moment to settle. We'll be using metaphors such as "settle our glitter" to help students remember that it is ok to take a good breath to relax and prepare for our next challenge.

We'll be planning field trips this year and welcoming visitors to our classroom. Students will be able to participate in activity period and our classes will be mixed throughout the day. We're excited to welcome our students back to the full school day, which starts at 8:00 in Advisee time and ends at 2:30.

### The Schedule:

Generally, students will have four classes each day, Unified Arts or Foreign Language, Core (Science/Social Studies), Math, and English/Language Arts. In Math, students will be by grade level this year. In all other classes, students will be in multi-age groups.
