to renovate, repair and/or remodel Central Elementary to include, but not be limited to: covered walkway, security cameras, restrooms and resurface the gym floor	\$100,000.00
to acquire and install flooring in Evenstart classrooms	<u>\$5,000.00</u>

Description of Unpaid/Unfinished Bonds Previously Approved by Voters of the Jurisdiction:

As of the 14th day of November, 2017, Independent School District No. 5, McCurtain County, Oklahoma, has 4 General Obligation bond issue(s) outstanding:

\$810,000 Building Bonds of July 1, 2014;
\$250,000 Combined Purpose Bonds of July 1, 2015;
\$220,000 Combined Purpose Bonds of June 1, 2017; and
\$1,500,000 Combined Purpose Bonds of July 1, 2017.

Detailed Description of the Use of Previous Bond Proceeds:

July 2014 Issue: perform Phase VI of the building renovation and improvement program to include, but not be limited to: replace HVAC system and upgrade electrical system at Idabel Middle School (100 NE Avenue D, Idabel, Oklahoma 74745).

July 2015 Issue: acquire and install technology equipment district-wide, as needed, and acquire vehicles for pupil transportation.

June 2017 Issue: acquire and install technology equipment district-wide, as needed, and acquire vehicles for pupil transportation.

July 2017 Issue: acquire and install technology equipment district-wide, as needed, and acquire vehicles for pupil transportation.
