Dear Cros-Lex Families:

On November 20, 2020, the middle school and high school administration was informed by the Sanilac County Health Department of two new confirmed positive COVID-19 cases, one middle, and one high school student. You can find updated information on our COVID-19 Dashboard [HERE](#),

Croswell Lexington Middle School will remain *OPEN* at this time. Croswell Lexington High School remains *CLOSED* to face to face learning at this time, through Tuesday December 8th.

We are working closely with the Sanilac County Health Department to identify Close Contacts of School Associated Cases of COVID-19. Anyone identified as a Close Contact will be notified by the health department as a part of the COVID-19 investigation process. Please answer the phone if the health department contacts you, as a contact tracer may be trying to reach you with important information. If you are contacted by the health department and asked to quarantine, please refer to the link [HERE](#) for further information. In addition to the County Health Department contact to families, the School Administration will also be in contact with families directly impacted by the quarantine.

We recommend taking action to help limit the spread of COVID-19, even if staff members or students are not experiencing symptoms:

- **Wear a mask** (covering mouth and nose) while in public places or if people who do not live with you must visit your home.
- **Practice social distancing** (maintaining a distance of 6 feet apart).
- **Practice frequent handwashing** (using soap for 20 seconds or hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol).
- **Follow [capacity restrictions](#)** of social gatherings.
- **Cover coughs and sneezes** with a tissue or with the inside of your elbow and immediately wash your hands.
- **Stay home if you are sick**; you can also follow the link to [get tested](#) or call 810.206.0682.

Thank you for understanding that, due to medical privacy laws, we are not able to release the names of the individuals with COVID-19. We will continue to communicate changes and updates with you. With your participation, we believe we can maintain a safe environment while also providing quality education.
