B. Discussion - any item on Consent Agenda - Board of Education Only

Trustees Klein and Gorfin discussed the nursing contract and agreed on an amendment to the resolution. Trustee Klein questioned the Gifted and Talented Policy. Mr. Burke discussed Block Scheduling with the potential to allow all grades 6-12 leave the building for lunch. This year, lunch is the main issue for an extended day. The board discussed their concerns with allowing students out for lunch. Mr. Burke proposed the option of having the district go all virtual from Thanksgiving to January. It is reasonable that families will travel during the holidays. During that period there are 17 school days. Trustee Gorfin suggested going virtual for a full day, from 7:50am to 3:00pm and also commented that return to in-person learning would need to be January 15, to quarantine after travelling. Trustee Gorfin asked about Personnel #6 which led to a discussion as to how stipends could be prorated, if necessary. Trustee Gorfin asked about the change in EXAID, and questioned why the Northern Valley tuition was \$10,750 through Bergen County Tech Schools. Mr. Burke replied that we do not determine the BCTS rates. Trustee Klein started a discussion among the board members regarding the Suicide Prevention Policy. She questioned the intensity of the training and other specifics within the Policy. President Villani thanked the Gallivan family and the EHB PTA for their generous donations.

C. Open floor to public comment on Consent Agenda only Citizens may address the Board of Education on any item listed on the agenda. Citizens will give their name and address when recognized to speak. A time limit of three minutes per person and a total of 30 minutes for all communications are allowed. Large groups are urged to select someone to represent them.

A resident asked why not use desks in the cafeteria and the gym as a holding space during cleaning; also who usually supervises during lunch? Mr. Burke replied the staff supervise as their duty period. Mr. Ortiz, 49 Palisade Ave., asked about Finance #4 and how many families have asked to borrow Chromebooks. Mr. Burke replied there have been about 100 requests.

Mr. Burke commented he's happy that the first CEF meeting is tomorrow. He commented that the Diversity and Inclusion meeting was an exceptional meeting and that minutes are forthcoming. The district's website is close to being ready. He hopes to live stream sports this year.

Mr. Spelbrink commented that changing to all virtual from Thanksgiving to Christmas could result in a lot of pushback and be seen as a step backward. He thinks that the lunch idea is great and asked if temperatures would be scanned after lunch again? What was the increase in students attending inperson for Phase 2? Mr. Burke replied approximately 5% to 8%, which is not as high as anticipated. Barbara Costa, 19 Park St., commented that the closure will encourage community members to travel, and she would prefer closure due to increased cases, not a planned closure.

Mr. Ortiz commented that he is on the Diversity Committee and agreed that it was a nice showing and a great effort, but questioned what would be done in the meantime. He questioned with the potential virtual learning would Kindergarten-Group B stay in the afternoon? Mr. Burke replied that the goal of all virtual would be to expand instruction.

TRUSTEE COMMENT

Trustee Odabashian commented that the virtual Back to School Night was really good this year. Mr. Burke replied that virtual BTSN may be kept in the future with a video with each teacher. Trustee Gorfin asked if and when the COVID form would be digital Mr. Burke replied that he was receiving push back about going electronic with the form.

Trustee Gorfin asked about the WiFi upgrade to which Ms. Delasandro replied that technicians are coming tomorrow.

Trustee Gorfin asked about the celebration at the Soccer Senior Nights. Mr. Burke replied that the marching band was not allowed to perform but the cheerleaders were allowed to participate. Trustee Klein commented the Business teacher seems great and is vivacious.
