- Promote and reinforce regular attendance with students and families at the Elementary and Middle School levels
- Assess families experiencing homelessness and provide McKinney Vento services to those that qualify
- Provide supportive counseling services to students, groups of students and families when at-risk for school difficulties
- Conduct home visits

- Participate in Problem Solving & TAT meetings to discuss curriculum supports for students
- Complete socio-cultural assessments for special education eligibility
- Connect families to local agencies
- Talk to school personnel to sensitize them to student-familyschool-community relations
- Advocate for the best interest of the student and family
