# Professional Development for the 2021-2022 School Year


- ★ Marion School District provided 730.75 hours of professional development between June 4, 2021 and June 3, 2022.
- ★ Teachers earned the 60 required professional development (PD) hours with 30 hours at back to school PD and the other 30 hours throughout the school year.
- ★ Our district instructional facilitators offered our staff technology, literacy, and math professional development during the summer break and at various meetings throughout the school year.
- ★ Some PD offerings included: RISE training, Reading Horizons, fact fluency and number sense ideas, curriculum alignment, student engagement strategies, Google Suite training, Google Classroom, and online tech tools training.
- ★ Facilitators also attend PLC meetings with magnet school teachers to offer targeted PD topics to grade specific groups.




### MSD ACT Aspire – 3rd Grade






### **MSD ACT Aspire – 4th Grade**






### **MSD ACT Aspire – 5th Grade**






### **MSD ACT Aspire – 6th Grade**










### **MSD ACT Aspire – 8th Grade**





# **MSD ACT Aspire – 10th Grade**





- ★ "Hybrid" school calendar continued for second year. Calendar spreads out school year, adding rejuvenation breaks after each nine weeks.
- ★ Edmentum Exact Path program implemented as our interim assessment tool. The tool provides a learning pathway for each student, pinpointing specific strengths and needs in reading, language arts, and math.



- ★ Earned acceptance into the state's Professional Learning Communities at Work program for VPA. Staff will receive intensive on-site support as they implement and sustain the PLC at Work program over the next three years.
- ★ District accepted into the PEER Network, a partnership with the Arkansas Public School Resource Center and the Crowley's Ridge Educational Service Cooperative.



- ★ Adopted two new literacy curricula for the district "Wit & Wisdom" for grades K-6, and "My Perspectives" for grades 7-9
- ★ Awarded a \$200,000 SOAR grant from the Arkansas Division of Elementary and Secondary education, to implement new literacy curriculum
- ★ Awarded a \$20,000 Staff Pipeline Subgrant to address recruitment and retention of teachers



- Hired a Behavior Specialist and a Board Certified Behavior Analyst
- ★ Continued commitment to championship-level sports teams and extracurricular activities across the district
- ★ Expanded the Patriot Academy to provide crucial support to teachers who are new to the district, and to ensure they have all the resources they need to be successful



- ★ New physical education building constructed at HCGC
- ★ Flooring has been renovated at the MJHS Annex and MST.
  MST has received a complete office renovation
- ★ Teacher workrooms have been upgraded at all campuses
- ★ New softball field and training facility will be open for 2023 season; new pressbox installed at baseball field



- ★ New paved road and parking lot constructed connecting L.H. Polk Drive with the MHS Fieldhouse
- ★ Partnered with Flex360 and Cherry Street Productions to increase awareness of the Marion School District in Crittenden County and across the region, specifically targeting families who may move into the region through new economic development projects in the region.



- ★ New exterior doors are being installed district-wide, including card-reader access controls at strategic locations
- ★ Purchased a state-of-the-art semi-trailer for use by the Marion Patriot Pride Marching Band
- ★ Hosted the 5A State Volleyball Tournament, bringing 16 teams into the community and providing a boost to the local economy



- ★ Joined with the Little Rock School District in a lawsuit challenging the state's ban on mask mandates. Winning an injunction in the case, this allowed the district to successfully implement a mask mandate during the worst of the Delta Variant surge
- ★ New HVAC units installed district-wide



- ★ New soccer practice fields constructed on Rica Road
- ★ Converted to a semi-monthly payroll for district employees
- ★ Courtyard improvements made at MHS, including a new outdoor seating area
- ★ Sound system upgraded at MPAC



- ★ Achieved unprecedented athletic success during the 2021-22 school year, sending five different sports teams to the state semifinals or beyond becoming the only school in Arkansas (in any classification) to achieve this milestone
- ★ MSD earned the "Best Communities for Music Education" designation from the NAMM Foundation



- ★ MST student K.J. Bingham Jr. selected to sing at Southwest Leadership Conference of the Boys & Girls Club
- ★ District live-stream video service earned three national awards through Mascot Media program
- ★ MHS math students racked up 29 awards at Regional Math Contest



- ★ 8 students earned Social Media Marketing certifications through their participation in a class at MHS
- ★ Senior baseball manager Bryce Wolford made regional headlines with his "home run" on Senior Night
- ★ MJHS Quiz Bowl Team qualifies for state competition for first time in program history



★ Band program makes history, earning coveted Sweepstakes Award at ASBOA Assessment, winning 3 Grand Championships in a row during fall marching season, seeing dozens of students earn All-Region honors, and sending numerous students to college on band scholarships

- ★ 2 MHS students were selected as recipients of the National African American Recognition Award

Every student in grades K-6 receive GT Whole Group Enrichment. MSD has a total of 118 students in grades 4-6 who are identified for GT pull-out in the three magnet schools.

There are 497 unique students at MJHS enrolled in at least one Honors Class.

★ 10th - 12th Honors and AP: Honors English 10, Honors Biology, Honors Geometry, and Honors Algebra II, Honors Chemistry, AP Calculus AB, AP English Language, AP English Literature, AP European History, AP US History, AP Statistics, AP US Government, AP World History, AP Psychology, AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Computer Science, and AP Studio Art

There are 310 unique students at MHS enrolled in at least one Honors/AP Class.



## 2021-22 Mileage & Meals

#### Miles Traveled from July 26, 2021- June 3, 2022: (84 Bus Routes)

- ★ 1,720 miles for regular daily routes
- ★ 306,160 miles total
- ★ 104,783 miles for non-route field trips, athletic trips, etc.

#### Meals Served from July 26, 2021- June 3, 2022:

- ★ 266,749 breakfast meals served to students and 26 served to adults
- ★ 417,535 lunch meals served to students and 2,092 served to adults
- ★ 2,593 snacks served to students
- ★ 688,995 total meals served



## Title I Funding

- ★ Visual & Performing Arts Magnet, Herbert Carter Global Community Magnet, and Math, Science & Technology Magnet are Title I schoolwide schools that use federal Title I funds to pay for additional instructional staff and supplies.
- ★ Marion High School also receives federal Title I funds as a Title I Targeted Assisted school.
- ★ Title I funds are federal funds that cannot be used to pay for anything required by state or local laws.
- ★ MSD's Title I allocation for the 2022-23 school year: \$1,173,478.31
- ★ Students are served based on academic need, not income levels. If a school has at least 40% of its students qualifying and has a plan to serve all students, it can become a Title I School-wide school that can serve all students at that school.



## **Title II-A Funding**

- ★ Title II-A targets professional development for teachers and administrators.
- ★ The district's Title II-A Teacher Quality program allocation this year (2022-23) is \$174,139.62.
- ★ Title II-A funds are used to pay 75% of the salary of a school improvement specialist to assist teachers with curriculum, technology, professional development and virtual learning.



## **Other Federal Funding**

- ★ Title III funds are used with our English language learners. MSD will receive \$11,164.43 in 2022-23.
- ★ Title IV funds are transferred into Title I and spent as Title I funds. MSD will receive \$68,710.61 in 2022-23.
- ★ Title I, Part D funds are used to support MSD students who reside in the East Arkansas Youth Shelter that is located in our district. MSD will receive \$7,988.42 in 2022-2023.



#### **Arkansas Better Chance (ABC) Preschool**

- ★ There are 3 ABC preschool classrooms on the VPA campus governed by the Crowley's Ridge Educational Cooperative Services in Harrisburg, AR.
- ★ The ABC Preschool program is funded to serve 3 classrooms with 20 students each.
- ★ The ABC Preschool program employs 3 certified teachers, 3 paraprofessionals, and 1 paraprofessional floater.
- ★ Ms. Leann Lester is the onsite supervisor.
- ★ Ms. Pam Castor, CRESC Director and Ms. Sharon Coburn, CRESC ABC Coordinator are in charge of the ABC Program on the VPA campus.
