

We continue to make progress on a number of items off the strategic plan. The Board approved a K-12 art teacher for next school year at the last board meeting. Our mass communication is now through Thrillshare/Apptegy. The student information system will transition from Tyler Technologies to Infinite Campus this summer. We are currently working behind the scenes with Infinite Campus with all the preparation work. A shout out to Nicole Arand, from Sharp Custom Painting, for her work painting the ceiling of our foyer with the Bronco logo. While Nicole was painting the ceiling, GariLynne Reed added some school colors replacing the brown on the walls with our Bronco purple. They both did a great job at giving our foyer a facelift. We are exploring utilizing Frontline Education Software to help us be more effective and efficient in the area of human resources, recruiting, business operations, and on-boarding. Another big item that has had a lot of movement within the past few months is our co-op with Freeport Aguin in junior high sports and 8-man football. We are still working with the 8-man football conference and NUIC conference to make that happen for next school year. Currently, we are in negotiations with the conference teams in 8-man football to make it happen for this coming school year. The teams get to vote on allowing the co-op. I don't see any issues making it happen for the following year, but we are still in negotiations with the conference about the 2023-2024 school year.

I spoke to the NUIC principals and athletic directors about the potential for a full co-op with all high school athletics/activities with Aquin in the future. There is paperwork that needs to be submitted with the IHSA and obviously a lot more discussions with Aquin and our stakeholders as we navigate this potentially happening.

We received almost \$28K in a combination of donations from Community Bank, a couple anonymous donors, Boosters, and OAA for a new scoreboard with stat panels. Loescher is donating their labor to install the scoreboards. The existing scoreboards will be repurposed and retrofitted with wireless controls to be utilized in the field house.

The couple last shout outs go to our girls basketball team for their successful season and to our woodworking students for continuing to create impressive projects. Our Lady Broncos were 11-1 in the conference, making them back-to-back conference champions. The team finished the season with a regional championship, a showing in the sectional finals, and an overall record of 28-5.

Our students in woodworking continue to make impressive pieces. They start with rough cut lumber and are learning how to use the planer, sanders, table saws, pocket-hole jigs, drills, routers, and several other tools in order to get a finished product.

So far this year, they have made a shelving unit, a piano bench, and most recently are finishing up a <u>desk</u>.

We will continue strategically working on the items from the <u>strategic plan</u> as we move forward, as they are part of the stepping stones towards the <u>shared vision</u>. I want to thank the staff, community, and board for their continued dedication towards improving Orangeville CUSD for our students! #GoBroncos

You'll fill out and return this packet at the screening.



In addition, we would like to know about any future kindergartners we should be expecting next year. If you live in-district, and your child will be entering kindergarten next year (and does not already attend Pre-K at Orangeville), please call or email Ms. Tonya Doyle (info above) or myself,

Ms. Rachel Heck, at 815-789-4289 or rheck@orangevillecusd.com to let us know about your incoming student. We will send you a new kindergarten student packet for you to fill out and return so that we will have your information for the upcoming registration session.

SPEAKING OF REGISTRATION... there is something new coming again this fall.

We have finally gotten used to the Tyler SIS, and doing online registration, which is great. Hopefully the process is similar and the transition will be smooth, but the company has decided not to continue this portion of their business, so we will be going to a new system, called Infinite Campus. I will be sending out more information on the transition as I learn about it, and as we get closer to the end of the school year, but I wanted to tell you now. This way you can keep an eye out for the information to come, and

prepare to expect some changes in that area for the summer/fall.

School

This system will still have parent & student portals, online registration & online pay capabilities, so hopefully it will be somewhat familiar. We still intend for online registration to happen mid-July, and as that time gets nearer, you will get more information and notifications from me. We will get through the changes together, just like when we moved from InformationNOW to Tyler SIS. ©

Speaking of Tyler SIS... Please check your parent portals for any outstanding fees. Online registration is really nice, but one thing that is hard for us is that there is no

longer a "last step" in the registration process - which when we did it in person was the fee listing. Now with everything online, it is easy to forget, or think that you already paid fees, when in reality they are still are owed. We have never required anyone to pay all their fees on registration day, but we do need you to please look at your fee listing now so that any outstanding fees can be

paid by the end of the school year. They can be paid in payments or all at once, and they can be paid online by card (plus convenience fee), or at school by check or cash. If you have questions about your fees, please feel free to call or email Ms. Tonya Doyle, myself Ms. Rachel Heck, or bookkeeper Mrs. Cindy Wells.







Check-In/Check-Out & Leave Policy

Campers and their families will need to check-in on <u>SUNDAY</u> between 6:00 -6:30 p.m. - No Exceptions!

Parents should return to camp check-out on <u>THURSDAY</u> between 6:00 - 6:30 p.m. Parents will be asked to provide a photo ID at check-out. <u>Early</u> departures are not allowed.

4-H Camp does not permit campers to leave during the camp week for activities such as sports, vacations, etc. Making special arrangements for individuals to leave can compromise the safety and services being provided for the group as a whole.

Speaking of Safety

Staff at RRCC are certified in First Aid, CPR and AED. There is a qualified first aid person at camp at all times. Campers select their own activities, and are supervised at all times. If there is an accident, or a problem with a camper, the parent/guardian is contacted immediately. Except in emergency situations, campers and counselors are not allowed to make or receive phone calls. 4-H Youth Development staff extensively train all camp counselors.

Life at 4-H Camp
