

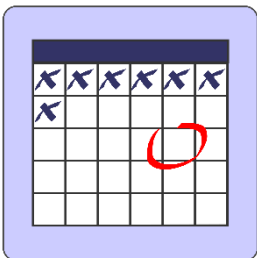

Hopefully it just brings spring weather. I think we're all ready for it. Regardless, I hope you all enjoyed your spring break.

Now that break is over, we are not only quickly coming to the end of this school year, but also trying to plan for next school year! I first want to remind you that if you know anyone that will have new students coming to the district this fall, please let them know to reach out soon. We are beginning the 'future student' information collection, so that we will be ready for online registration when it comes in July.



If your family has a new student enrolling in the fall, you should please contact myself, Ms. Rachel Heck at rheck@orangevillecusd.com or 789-4289, or elementary secretary Ms. Tonya Doyle at tdoyle@orangevillecusd.com or 789-4450. We will send you a new student packet, to be returned before the end of the school year. Also, preschool screening is coming up on April 20th, and we encourage you to schedule an appointment if you're interested. If your child is 2 yrs. 9 mos. to 5 years old and hasn't been screened before, Ms. Tonya can schedule you and send you a packet. You'll fill out the packet ahead of time and return it at the screening.



Because we have used all our emergency days this year, the final day is no longer 'tentative'. The last day of school this year is Tuesday, June 6th, which is a half day, releasing at 11:00 am. The 2023-24 calendar for next school year was also approved at the March board meeting. As usual, it is subject to state approval before it is final, but it is included later in this newsletter.

I am reminding everyone again, as we are nearing the end of the school year, to please look at your Tyler SIS parent portals to check if you have outstanding fee balances. We have never required families



to pay their entire bill at the beginning of the school year or at registration, but there are many out there that have not made any payments on their accounts at all. If that includes you, perhaps breaking the balance up into monthly or bi-weekly installments for the remaining three months of our fiscal year would be easier than paying it all at once. Then you can start with a clean slate in the fall, and in our new system.



Yes, another new system. As I said in the last newsletter, we will be moving from Tyler SIS to a program called Infinite Campus. Like Tyler, they have parent and student portals that can be checked online, as well as apps that can be downloaded to check the portals. There will be more information coming out as the school year comes to a close. This information does still come electronically, so if your email has changed, please make sure to let us know so that we have the most updated way to contact you, as parents.



Finally, I end as usual, by reminding you that if you're willing to download & use it, the Box Tops for Education app can help the school earn money when you buy things you would usually buy, and then scan the receipt with the app. Box Tops even had a new brand join... Old El Paso, as seen to the right. We also continue to collect Coca Cola codes and Loaves 4 Learning bread-shaped UPCs.



Well, that's enough for me this month. Every year I say the school year goes faster than the prior one, and every year I think it's true. Because next time I write will be for the final newsletter of the school year, May-June. 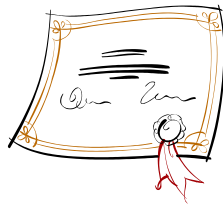

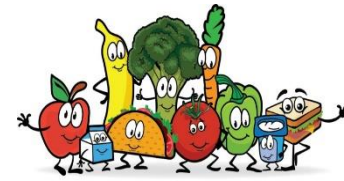

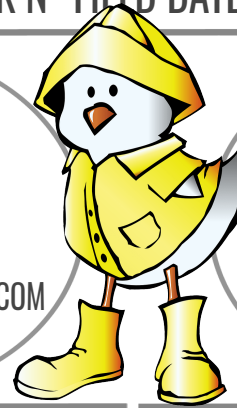

Check-In/Check-Out & Leave Policy

Campers and their families will need to check-in on SUNDAY between 6:00 -6:30 p.m. - No Exceptions!

Parents should return to camp check-out on THURSDAY between 6:00 - 6:30 p.m. Parents will be asked to provide a photo ID at check-out. Early departures are not allowed.

4-H Camp does not permit campers to leave during the camp week for activities such as sports, vacations, etc. Making special arrangements for individuals to leave can compromise the safety and services being provided for the group as a whole.

Speaking of Safety

Staff at RRCC are certified in First Aid, CPR and AED. There is a qualified first aid person at camp at all times. Campers select their own activities, and are supervised at all times. If there is an accident, or a problem with a camper, the parent/guardian is contacted immediately. Except in emergency situations, campers and counselors are not allowed to make or receive phone calls. 4-H Youth Development staff extensively train all camp counselors.

We strive to maintain an environment that both encourages personal growth and creates an unforgettable summer experience.
