Now that we are in the winter months, please tune in to our local radio stations WHZR 103 FM, WLHM 102.3 FM, WSAL 1230 AM, WKHY 93.5 FM, WMRS 107.7 FM, WWKI 100.5 FM, WXXB 102.9 FM for any information concerning delays or closings. These announcements are usually made between 6:00 and 6:30 a.m. Information will also be on cable channel 6, channel 7, channel 13 (cable Channel 12), Channel 16 (cable Channel 5), and School Network Channel 18. Keep in mind that a delay could be extended to a full day. Be sure that your child knows what he/she is supposed to do in case of an early release due to inclement weather. Please remember to dress your child according to the weather. It is always better to dress your child in layers. Also, send a hat and gloves for your child. There are times when the class may still have outside recess.

National Handwashing Awareness Week is December 6-12, 2020

Washing your hands is easy and it's one of the best ways to prevent the spread of germs.

Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds especially after you have been in a public place, or after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.

- * It's especially important to wash:
 - * Before eating
 - * Before touching your face
 - * After using the restroom
 - * After leaving a public place
 - * After blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing
 - * After handling your mask
- If soap and water are not readily available, use a hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol. Cover all surfaces of your hands and rub them together until they feel dry.
 - Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
