What is Cub Scouting?

Cub Scouting is a flexible, year-round program that focuses on teaching youth in grades 5K-5th grade to be the best version of themselves! The aims of Scouting are to develop character, citizenship, personal fitness, and leadership.

How does the program work?



Small Groups

Scouts work together in a group of six to eight children in the same grade where they develop new skills and interests, they practice sportsmanship and good citizenship, and they learn to do their best. Youth are recognized through an advancement plan that provides fun for the Scout, and teaches goal setting and achievement.



Family Involvement

Whether a Cub Scout lives with two parents or one, a foster family, or other relatives, their family is an important part of Cub Scouting. Parents and adult family members provide leadership and support for Cub Scouting and help ensure that Scouts have a good experience in the program.



Adventures

Cub Scouts participate in a huge array of activities, including camping, canoeing, climbing, fishing, archery, service projects, games, and many other adventures! Besides being fun, these activities offer opportunities for growth, achievement, and family involvement.

Is Scouting safe?

The safety of children in our programs is the most important priority of the Boy Scouts of America. We take great pride in the quality of our adult leadership. The BSA uses a multilayered adult leader selection process that includes criminal background checks, mandatory youth protection training, and a code of conduct agreement. We are committed to injury and illness prevention by integrating safety measures in our handbooks, literature, and training materials, including the Guide to Safe Scouting which is available to view online.



How does the program work?



Flexibilty

Families have the ability to choose Cub Scouts for their sons AND daughters. Families today are busier than ever and with less free time, families want convenience. Research shows that our programs are extremely appealing to today's busy families. Most Scout groups hold 2-3 one-hour meetings and one weekend activity per month. Any missed meetings can be made up at home with a Scout's family.
