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Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Sand Creek Community Schools. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and some requirements of state laws. Our staff is available to help you understand this information. Please contact Sand Creek Community Schools' superintendent, Sharon Smith, for help if you need assistance.

These reports contain the following information:

Student Assessment Data

- Includes the following three assessments: M-STEP (Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress), MI-Access (Alternate Assessment), and College Board SAT
- Presents assessment information for English language arts and mathematics for grades 3 to 8 and 11, and MI-Access science for grades 4, 7, and 11, compared to state averages for all students as well as subgroups of students.

School Accountability Data

- Includes information on schools' performance on various measures such as student proficiency and growth on state assessments, graduation, and attendance rates. Performance is measured on 0-100 index scales
- Reports schools identified under three federally required categories for further support: Comprehensive Support and Improvement, Targeted Support and Improvement, and Additional Targeted Support

Educator Qualification Data

- Identifies the number and percentage of inexperienced teachers, principals, and other school leaders
- Reports teachers who are teaching with emergency or provisional credentials
- Includes teachers who are not teaching in the subject or field for which they are certified

NAEP Data (National Assessment of Educational Progress)

• Provides state results of the national assessment in mathematics and reading every other year in grades 4 and 8

Civil Rights Data

• Provides information on school quality, climate, and safety

Review the table below listing our schools. For the 2022-23 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given.

In closing, I'd like to congratulate our school district on completing a successful school year despite the challenges that faced administration, teachers, support staff, students and parents in the midst of the global pandemic and constantly changing health department protocols and guidelines. I'd also like to thank and congratulate the school district employees on their sincere commitment and efforts over this past year. Sand Creek Community Schools will continue to strive for excellence by focusing on improving our student achievement scores as well as continuing to implement our K-12 Social Emotional Learning curriculum (Lions Quest), MTSS and PBIS for our students. Last year, the district implemented the K-12 NWEA assessment test that will provide real, usable instant academic data on each student. Teachers and administrators will be able to use this data to identify needs within our curriculum and instruction, as well as identify students needing extra help and support. This data will help drive conversations with both student and parent as we create and work towards achieving student goals. We have implemented three – 2-hour delay starts this school year to give teachers time to spend digging into the data. The district has also begun implementation of MTSS (Multi-tiered System of Support) and has started training on PBIS. PBIS will be implemented during the 2022-23 school year.

The detailed systems work involved in MTSS will provide the foundation for us to better evaluate and assess current processes and programs, as well as ensure the successful roll out of new programs. We welcome all feedback from our constituents, and we invite all interested community members to attend our school board meetings. Parents wishing to give more time to our school district can contact their respective building principals.
