

District qualified organizational groups as described in this policy may conduct attractions and raffles on district property for charitable purposes. The District Administrator has the responsibility to deny raffles, or other games, deemed incompatible with district mission or values.

District qualified organizational groups as described in this policy, may conduct up to 10 attraction or raffles during a one year period.

Each Organization must apply for qualification in writing annually. Written applications will be reviewed at the district Policy level and qualified by the Board of Education in open session with a majority vote.

District qualified organizational groups shall have on file at the district office state required licensing if any. The district is not responsible for determining this requirement or interpretation of state law.

Organization Type

Service: A local organization which has, as a minimum, the benefit, the growth and the general welfare of the community and the school district as one of its principle purposes. This category includes but is not limited to, curricular and co-curricular organization, community service groups such as the Cambridge Community Activities Program and civic foundations.

Charitable: A local organization will be classed as such if the dominant purpose of its work is for the public good, and the work done for its members is but the means adopted for this purpose. This category includes but is not limited to, Community service groups such as the Cambridge Community Activities Program, Booster Clubs and civic foundations.

Fraternal: A local organization with a representative form of government that (1) operates under the board system with a formal procedure of operation; (2) is organized to promote some worthy civic, charitable or service purpose.

Religious: A local and established religious institution or group thereof.

District qualified local organizational groups as described in this policy may conduct charitable activities and raffles in two class categories

Category Class

Class A

Required to conduct an attraction or raffle with some type of potential reward, in which either some or all of the tickets for that attraction or raffle are sold on the same day or other than the same day as the drawing. Class A attraction or raffles are in conjunction with special events or other money making charitable activities that involve the purchase of a ticket to participate with some type of potential reward.

Class A activities with some type of potential reward shall limit the number of same day attraction or raffle tickets sold to 200 tickets for each event. Potential rewards shall not be greater than \$100 per same day attraction or raffle event. This category further limits the number of ticket value purchased by any one individual to \$5.00 per same day attraction or raffle event.

Each district qualified organizational group shall not offer more than one attraction or raffle during any same day event. Ticket sales for an attraction or raffle shall comply with this policy and state law.

Class B

Required to conduct an attraction or raffle in which all of the tickets for that event are sold on the same day as the drawing. Class B must be in conjunction with Presentations, Performances or Displays of Skills, Abilities, etc. Cash rewards are prohibited in the class.

Each district qualified organizational group shall not offer more than one attraction or raffle during any same day event. Ticket sales for an attraction or raffle shall comply with this policy and state law.
