Dual Credit Course Options at Jourdanton High School

Jourdanton High School has the following academic dual credit course options. History 1301 and 1302 are taught on campus by a college adjunct and high school teacher. The remainder of the courses must be taken on-line. Students will have a period of time during the school day for their on-line courses. These courses are hosted through Palo Alto College which is one of the Alamo Colleges. The Alamo Colleges of San Antonio have an agreement with all major Texas universities that these courses will transfer. However, with hundreds of colleges and degrees that change routinely, parents and students are advised to contact the college or university they plan to attend and find out if the course will transfer for the student's intended major.

History 1301 and History 1302 (United States History)

May be taken summer before a student's 11th grade year or during the 11th grade year

- Fulfills high school US History graduation requirement for 11th grade social studies
- Students must take STAAR History test after they have taken these courses.
- Fulfills 6 college hour US history requirement in Texas
- STUDENT WILL STILL BE REQUIRED TO PASS THE STAAR HISTORY EOC TEST

English 1301 and English 1302 (Composition and Rhetoric)

May be taken summer before a student's 11th grade year or during the 11th or 12th grade year

- Fulfills English 3 graduation requirement if taken during 11th grade year
- Fulfills 6 college hour English composition and rhetoric requirement in Texas

Government 2305 (American Government)

May be taken after successfully completing US History

- Fulfills 1 semester social studies government graduation requirement for 12th grade
- Fulfills 3 college hour American government requirement in Texas

Economics 2301 (Macroeconomics)

May be taken after successfully completing US History and Algebra 2

- Fulfills 1 semester economics graduation requirement for 12th grade
- Is one of several courses that can be used to satisfy Social and Behavioral Science component area. Other courses like psychology and sociology can also meet this requirement.
- Students majoring in business in college will need economics. Students choosing other college majors will not need economics for college and may choose to take high school economics.

Math 1314 (College Algebra)

May be taken after successfully completing Algebra 2

- Fulfills 1 semester high school Math Elective
- Fulfills 3 college hour math requirement for some degrees. Many degrees require higher level math classes be taken.

English 2322 and English 2323 (British Literature)

May be taken by 12th graders if ENGL 1301 and 1302 were successfully completed for English 3 graduation requirement

- Fulfills English 4 graduation requirement for 12th grade
- English 2322 fulfills 3 college hour requirement for Language, Philosophy and Culture foundation component area

Students applying to and qualifying to the Alamo Academy programs may earn both academic and career and technology courses that will satisfy high school graduation credits. The courses taken will be determined by the program they are enrolled in.
