Section 1 of Article VIII of the Michigan Constitution of 1963:

and the means of education shall forever be encouraged.

It is the natural, fundamental right of parents and the legal guardians to determine and direct the care, teaching and education of their children. The public schools of this state serve the needs of the pupils by cooperating with the pupil's parents and legal guardians to develop the pupil's intellectual capabilities and vocational skills in a safe and positive environment.

Religion, morality and knowledge being necessary to good government and the happiness of mankind, schools
