**Lawton Public Schools
Communicable Disease Policy**

For the protection of all school children and staff, students should be kept home or will be sent home in the following situations:

- Students with a fever of 100 degrees or more will be sent home and can return when the student is fever free for a 24 hr period without the use of fever reducing medications.
- Students with vomiting and/or diarrhea will be sent home and can return when the student has not had an episode for a 24 hr period without the use of medication.
- Students with any type of rash or eruption of the skin will be sent home. Students can return the following day if the rash/eruption of the skin is no longer visible. If the rash remains visible the following day, a clearance must be obtained by a physician stating the diagnosis and they are clear to return to school.
- Students with any inflammation of the eye or lid will be sent home. Students can return the following day if the inflammation of the eye or lid is no longer visible. If the inflammation of the eye or lid remains visible the following day, a clearance must be obtained by a physician stating the diagnosis and they are clear to return to school.
