# LEARNING OBJECTIVES/GOALS

**ELA/Reading:** Scholars will learn more about informational texts by analyzing author's purpose.

**Words of the Week (Spelling words are typically test every two weeks):**

- **Vocabulary for the Week:** marine, ecosystem, flying bridge, chlorophyll, nautical
- **Spelling for the Week (Open and Closed Syllables):** agent, recent, apex, vital, rotate, musical, donut, solar, vacation, slogan, malice, recommend, energetic, register, lavish, topical, enemy, honest, element, minimum

\*Challenge Spelling: hypnotizing, epidemic, equinox

**Writing:** Scholars can use elements of informational writing to write an informational article. Scholars will also distinguish irregularities in subject-verb agreement.

**Social Studies:** How do we learn through our observations? A look into Protecting Elements of Nature (i.e. National Park Services)

**Math:** Lessons #31-#35 (Lines, Angles, Polygons, Rounding Numbers, Division w/ zeros in the quotient, word problems) and Assessment #4 (covers lessons #24-#30) \*Due to different class scheduling, math lessons may vary for the fifth grade team\*
