
Northside K-8 School Core Belief

Restart Plan



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- Engineering is Elementary (EiE) Program implemented throughout school year.
- Google Classroom instructional model with a one-to-one student chromebook ratio for all all students.
- Flexible Calendar -Remote learning calendar days will be used for additional professional development (google classroom, data digs, instructional software implementation, and MTSS student identifications and development of intervention strategies.
- In-school day time tutors will be hired to service identified students in grades 3rd-8th.



Restart Plan



Continued implementation of the Dual Language
 Spanish Immersion Program in grades K-6.

- Implementation of a schoolwide blended learning instruction. Students will interact with research based educational reading and math software (iReady, Study Island, Houghton Mifflin Harcourt, Accelerated Reader, Star Reader and Star Math).
- Incorporation of "Day Tutors"

Raising Student Achievement Strategies

- Northside K-8 Jumpstart Intervention Program
- Implementing STEM challenges and content through Engineering is Elementary (EIE) for grades K-8.
- Curriculum MTSS Coach will provide content professional development and coaching sessions for staff in the areas of data analysis, blended learning, and Multi-tier System Support.
- Every classroom teacher will have a class data notebook, flexible student grouping configurations, and individualized student educational plans for at risk students will be developed.



Subgroup Goals

- 2020-2021 Exceptional Children Subgroup Target Proficiency Strategies
- Goal for 2019- 2020 Increase by one letter from a D to a C or higher
 - Curriculum MTSS Coach will provide professional development on how teachers can not only use Multi-tier Support System to identify struggling students, but also as an resources for creating intervention plan.
 - Exceptional children will be invited to participate in the Northside Jumpstart Academy.
 - Teachers will work collaboratively with Exceptional Resource teachers to implement modifications within the classroom.
 - Small group pull out instruction will be provided by EC Resource Teacher based on IEP goals. Additional support will be provided with current content grade level work.
 - Additional after school tutoring offered to English Language Learners to bridge language instructional barriers.



COVID 19 Virtual Classroom Safety Goals

Teachers utilize Aristotle computer software to monitor students while online.
 Goggle Meet and Zoom software features will be activated by classroom teachers to deter cyber bullying and ensure student internet safety.

Attendance Goals





- Increase student daily average membership by 5% using PBIS incentive.
 - 2018-2019 we were at 92.23%
 - 2019-2020 we were at 91.93% (COVID 19)
- Continue partnering with Faith Based Organization to sponsor student incentives, i.e. pizza party, for promoting perfect attendance.
- Counselor will send out 5 and 10 day absence letters
 - Utilize school social worker to assist in contacting parents in order to deter student absenteeism.
