Our NC State School Report Card

- Letter grade of "C" for the 2018-2019 academic year
- Composite score of 57 (50 x $.8 = 40 + 84.8 \times .2 = 16.96$)
- Growth Index Score of 16.96
- An increase of at least 13 points in our composite score enables us to return to a "B" while continuing our commitment to meeting and ultimately exceeding growth

Graduation Rate & ACT Proficiency

- Our cohort graduation rate improved from 83.8% in 2019 to 87.9% last year.
- Our goal for 2021 is at least a 91% graduation rate.

- In 2021, our goal is an ACT proficiency rate of 60%.
- This would be an increase from 48% in 2019.

School Improvement Plan Indicators

- **A4.01** The school will implement a tiered instructional system that allows teachers to deliver evidence-based instruction aligned to the individual needs of students; differentiation.
- **E1.06** The school regularly communicates with parents/guardians about its expectations of them and the importance of the curriculum of the home; bridging the between home/school.
- **C2.01** The LEA/school will regularly look at performance data and aggregate classroom observation data and uses that data to make decisions about school improvement and professional development needs; PLCs, EVASS, NCEES.

Meeting Our Goal for EOCs



- Our goal is to increase our proficiency rates by at least ten percentage points on each EOC.
- Each EOC course is preceded by a fall introductory class, allowing students ninety-five minutes of study in each of these disciplines for the full duration of the academic year. This permits Math I to be preceded by Foundations of Mathematics, biology by the introduction of biology course and English II by Reading Strategies.
- Partner with the North Carolina Virtual Public School (NCVPS) to establish a co-teaching model in each EOC course.
- Structure Block III Joust course to include remediation four days a week, with Wednesday devoted to social-emotional learning.
- Thorough analysis of invaluable EVAAS data.
- Provide instructional coaching and professional development through WCS and New Tech Network.
- Utilize a standards-based online assessment system to complement daily instruction (e.g., Schoolnet).

Increasing Our Graduation Cohort Rate

- Our goal remains to continue to move in a positive direction in enhancing our graduation rate.
- Continuing credit recovery classes for those who did not enjoy initial success in a particular class.
- On-going senior and parent/guardian meetings on the critical nature of securing one's high school diploma on tim⁻

Improving Proficiency ACT



- Our goal is to increase our level of student proficiency on this important indicator of collegeand career-readiness from 48.0% to 60% for 2021.
- For the fall of 2020, a stand-alone ACT Preparation class has been established; our intention is to offer this course each semester every academic year.
- Joust again incorporates enrichment and remediation for all students, particularly those most in need of assistance, four days a week for upwards of ninety-five minutes.
- Explore the use of Title I funds to employ tutors to support students and families.
- Host a family information night to assist parents/guardians on how they might assist in preparing their child for this important indicator of college- and career-readiness, including registering for the test.

Increase parental involvement from 35% to 50%
