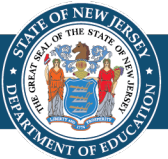




NJGPA Field Test Legislation



- July 5, 2022, Governor Murphy signed P.L.2022, c.60 (ACS for A-3196/S-2349), which requires the State Board of Education to administer the NJGPA as a field test for class of 2023.
- The law also prohibits the results of the NJGPA field test (First Pathway), a substitute competency test (Second Pathway), or portfolio appeal (Third Pathway) from being used as prerequisite for graduation for students expected to graduate in the class of 2023.
- There is no graduation assessment requirement for any student who is expected to graduate with the class of 2023.

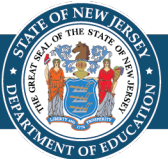




NJGPA Field Test Result Considerations



- NJGPA field test results from spring 2022 may be used to:
 - Review curriculum and programming.
 - Identify potential focus areas in preparation for the spring 2023 administration of NJGPA to students expected to graduate in the class of 2024.

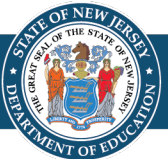




NJGPA Overview



- NJGPA is designed to measure the extent to which students are graduation ready in English Language Arts (ELA) and Mathematics.
- Graduation readiness is reported separately for each content component.
- The ELA component is aligned to the grade 10 standards.
- The Mathematics component is aligned to Algebra I and Geometry standards.

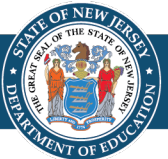


Spring 2022 NJGPA Participation Rate

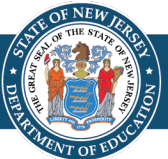


Spring 2022 NJGPA Field Test Administration Results: Comparison of EPSD and the State of New Jersey

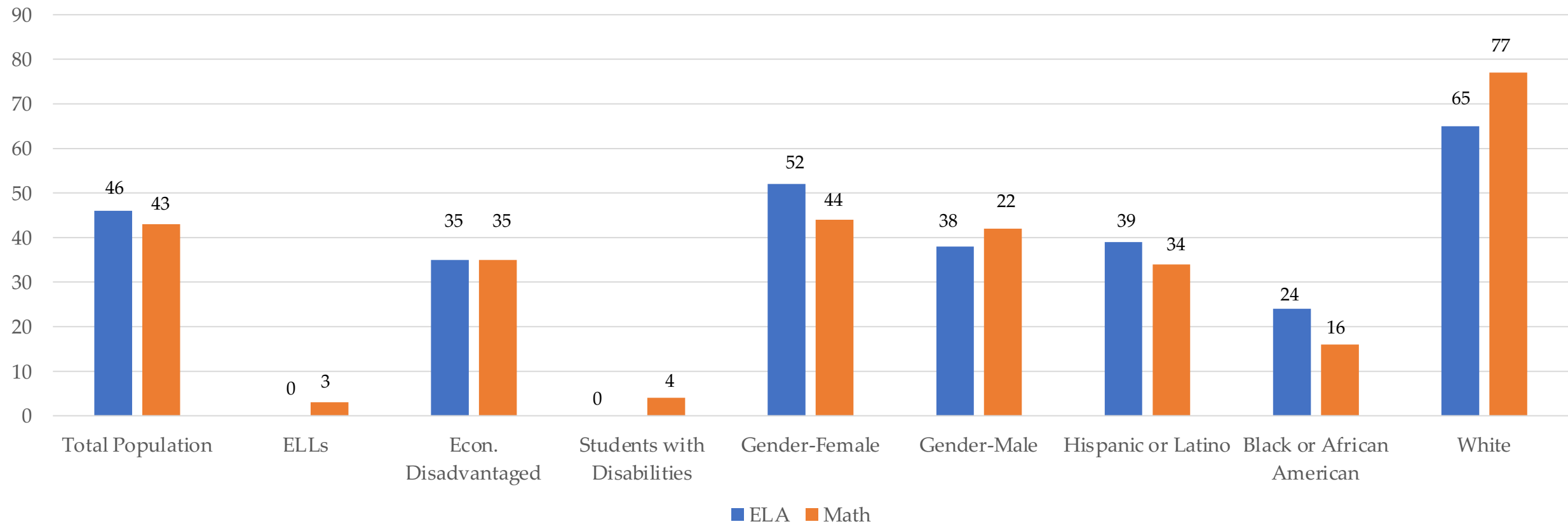




Percentages of Students Graduation Ready within Subgroup Categories

Intervention Strategies



- Planning of the 2023-24 master schedule has begun to further refine the course offerings and remediation process.
- Planning pilot implementation of Read180 for portions of the student body that are in need.
- Offering Pre-Algebra to prepare students for Algebra I as 10th graders



Notable Achievements



- Implementation of a new master schedule that allowed for additional academic electives in accordance with RtI and enrichment models.
 - Electives include, but not limited to:
 - Math Lab
 - National Math and ELA Review
 - Conquering the State Test Prep
- Reimplementation of Bilingual/ESL Education in core subjects. Thus, allowing students to learn in their native language while learning English.
- Recognitions:
 - 12 students recognized by the College Board as AP Scholars
 - 9 students were acknowledged by the National Merit Scholarship Program by Letter of Commendation
