· Freedom from Machines: We are so dependent on machines, from counting money, calculating bills and from telling time. Do you remember when your grandparents had those white or yellow tablets with monthly calculations of bills?

Developing the language of Math in the home and the environment: I found my mother's high school math book from 1948. Every new mathematical practice had a real word application, from building a house to wiring a doorbell.

· Practicing Mathematics: Estimations, calculations, explaining what is needed, problem solving are all practice. If you practice Math, it may not get you to Carnegie Hall stage, but you could buy a front row ticket once you become the CEO of the top Fortune 500 Company!

Let's embark on this changing the Mathematical Mindset (Joan Boaler) so our childrenwill be competitive now and in the near


