# A MESSAGE FROM JULIE KLAPPER, SCHOOL NURSE

Hello and Welcome back to school! The goal of the Health Office is to ensure that each student has a happy, healthy, and successful school experience. Healthy children are better learners and your child's health is important to his/her success. The school nurse works closely with teachers, administrators, and support staff to ensure the overall wellbeing of both our students and staff. If you have any questions or concerns, please feel free to contact me either by phone 201-862-6112 or email jklapper@epsd.org.

#### Please note the following:

- **1.** Make sure your child's/children's emergency contact information is up to date in Genesis. This includes emergency contacts and individuals authorized to pick up your child/children from school. When picking up your child, please remember to bring identification.
- 2. Immunizations: Please make sure your child's vaccines are up to date and documentation is submitted to the Health Office. The Flu vaccine is required for all students in PreK 3 and PreK 4. Children who do not have documentation of receiving the flu vaccine or do not have a valid medical or religious exemption by December 31st will need to be excluded from school until the end of flu season, which is up until March 31st in New Jersey.
- **3.** Medications: If your child requires medication (OTC included) to be given during the school day, please have your physician complete the medication authorization form. This form can be found on our website under the Quarles' health page https://www.epsd.org/o/quarles/page/medication-in-school All medication should be brought to school in the original container, appropriately labeled by the pharmacy.
- 4. Illness: Please DO NOT send your child/ children to school if they are sick and/ or have COVID like symptoms. You will be called to pick up your child IMMEDIATELY from school. It is important to note that guidelines and recommendations are subject to change at any time from the CDC and NJDOH. We ask that parents/guardians monitor their child/children for signs of infectious illness every morning and to please keep them home if they are symptomatic. According to the CDC, "The most important thing that you can do to keep from getting sick is to wash your hands." Hands should be washed frequently with soapy water for at least 20 seconds. Please practice with your child / children proper hand washing.

I am looking forward to working with you and your child/children to keep everyone safe and healthy.






#### Ms. Borowski's Class


