

Mr. Hunt Second Grade

First grade has been working on subtracting within 20. They have been learning different techniques on how to subtract. In science they have been wrapping up the unit on sound and light waves. I also added radio waves into that unit as well.

Second grade has been learning about 2 digit addition and subtraction. This is one of my favorite units of second grade because they get to put together everything they know to start adding huge numbers! In science they have been learning about sudden events/natural disasters. They have learned about tornadoes, volcanoes, hurricanes, floods, tsunamis and landslides.

Miss Inman Third Grade

This month the third grade has really stepped it up a notch. Our Daily 5 activities have been going so well that I've begun meeting with small groups of students to work on reading goals. One of the groups is even getting to start their first ever literature circle. They've chosen to read Diary of a Wimpy Kid by Jeff Kimmey.

They will also get to choose a job to do while reading like summarizing the chapter, making predictions, asking questions, or defining words. While we haven't had our first meeting yet, the students involved are very excited.

In Science we've begun talking about Natural Hazards and ways to minimize the damage they cause. The class was excited to learn about lightning rods and how they work. They have also come up with many unique ways that they think they could stop a flood. So, find a Burr Oak third grader if your basement is a little wet.

In math, we've moved onto multiplication. The students were both nervous and excited when we made the leap from subtraction to multiplication. After learning 1s and 0s, the students were shocked to discover how easy it can be. However, we've moved onto bigger numbers and students are working daily with flashcards to try to memorize as many facts as they can. While multiplication has been difficult for many of the students, they are all improving and working toward an ice cream treat for those who gave it their best effort.

Hello families! We are off and running in our final stretch of 2020. December may be a short school month, but, I guarantee it is going to be PACKED with lots of activities, work, and learning. Mr. Sutton M.S. Social Studies

The 5th grade U.S. History class is learning about European explorers who left Europe and journeyed to different places in North America. Moving forward, students will be examining how the Europeans interacted with the native people and how North America changed because of these interactions.

In 6th grade, students have been learning about the geography of South America. Students are studying the different regions and cultures of

people in South America. The class is also looking in depth at population density of different places around the world.

The 7th grade social studies class is finishing up the study of Asia. Students are learning about the different governments and economies found in Asia. Next, students will begin studying the characteristics of the first civilizations.

The 8th grade is continuing work on early U.S. History. They are studying innovations in technology during the early 19th century. They will also be studying a time period known as Jacksonian Democracy and Westward Expansion.

Mrs. Rifenburgh M.S. Math

5th Grade students have been working so much better these last few weeks. It has taken some adjustment for all of us to remember that the students missed almost half a year of new material last year due to the shut down. With that in mind, I have had greater success in meeting them where they are and working toward 5th grade material. They have mastered adding and subtracting decimal digits and now are finishing up with multiplying decimals. We will be beginning a study in fraction addition and subtraction which are important concepts. Please continue to monitor their work and reinforce an expectation that they do their best work on time.

The majority of students are struggling with the multiplication facts and without these, all the concepts prove to be difficult. Please set up a time, maybe 20 minutes an evening, to have them practice in one of the online sites such as multiplication.com. They know many more.

6th Grade students started the year with fraction operations. We have now mastered

working with decimals including division and I am very pleased with the success these students had with this topic. We are now into working with positive and negative numbers and once again, they are most impressive with this topic. Now to just keep them from getting confused when we change the rules when multiplying and dividing.

7th Grade students learned to evaluate, write and solve equations. We have moved onto inequalities. We will be solving them as well as writing and graphing them. Most students in the 7th Grade Class work extremely well and are very conscientious toward their schoolwork. I thank them and their parents for the reinforcement at home. and I have been extremely pleased with the effort these students have been putting into their work.

8th Grade students are an amazing group of young people to work with. They work well in class and ask questions when they need to. We are easily moving through the concepts for 8th grade. We just finished the Pythagorean Theorem, Distance and Midpoint Formulas. We are now going to begin linear equations which will involve slope and that is a big expectation in 8th grade. Stocking Stuffer??? All students have been provided with a whiteboard for their personal use. If there is any chance you could pick up a package of dry erase markers for them to use, it would be a great help. I find my students like to do their work on whiteboards rather than pencil and paper.

Mrs. Milliman M.S. ELA

We are just about half way through this crazy year! Overall we are making this work and being successful. The 5th grade class has been split up

according to their abilities and are working on closing the gap for those that are lower in reading. Some students will be working with Mrs. McCall who is completing her student teaching for English. These students will be working on reading Charlotte's Web and focusing on key foundational skills to help get them on track in reading. The other half of the class that is with me will be finishing up learning about how to properly respond to written response questions using the Restate, Answer, Cite, and Explain (RACE) strategy and moving back into the Reading Street Curriculum.

6th Grade students will be finishing up learning how to properly respond to written responses using the Restate, Answer, Cite, and Explain (RACE) strategy and moving back into the Reading Street curriculum. We will be hitting hard how to write longer responses and move beyond just answering questions with basic answers.

7th grade students are finishing up how to properly respond to written responses using citations and explanations. Students will be working on a unit talking about Informational Literacy. Students will be given a tragedy and have to research how they could survive their tragedy. After winter break, we will begin reading The Giver.

8th graders have finished The Help and writing an argumentative essay. They will begin working on a Communications in ELA unit where they will be researching global issues and working on presenting the information on the topic. After winter break, we will begin reading the graphic novel version of The Diary of Anne Frank.

Can you believe that the holidays are here already? Wow! All of my classes are moving at a good pace to meet the content expectations. Geometry, Algebra 1 and Algebra 2 have all taken multiple assessments and are pushing forward gaining knowledge each day. World History is working on a unit about ancient Greece. Wars in the 20th Century and Fight for Your Rights are on pace to finish up this semester. My senior math class is continuing to work through a personal finance curriculum and learn to save for their futures and manage their money. Look at the "classwork" tab under each class as well (this gives a FULL list of all the assignments for each class).

Some students are just showing their parents a one-page summary of assignments for all of their classes, but that doesn't always paint the whole picture. (Hence the need to look at each class separately)

Look at the work your child has TURNED IN, make sure it is complete (sometimes these sweet cherubs turn in incomplete work, just so that it looks like it's done, and it disappears from their to-do list.)

Compare assignments & grades from Google Classroom to Synergy grade book. Is your child missing key assignments or projects?

Help your child prioritize missing and late assignments. Anything over 10 days late will no longer be accepted for credit unless arrangements have been made with the individual teacher (per late-work policy).

Mrs. Sutton H.S. Science

Physical Science - Students have been learning about the periodic table. Students will be learning about valence electrons and how they are important when making bonds.

Life Science - Students have been learning about the different types of cycles that occur on Earth. Students will be exploring the greenhouse effect and global climate change next.

Intro to Esports - Students have been learning how to maintain a healthy lifestyle while playing video games. We have also looked into video game careers.

Earth/Space Science - Students have been learning about weathering and erosion. Next we will be looking at Earth's history.

Solid Professor - This engineering software class is learning a lot about Onshape. Our students will continue to learn about this software. The goal of this course is for students to earn their certification to help them in their future careers.

Middle/High School Esports Club - If your student signed up for the Esports Team (not the intro to esports course), they need to check their tournaments dates. 




