

From the Chairman

The Marian Award is given each year to a person who would serve as a role model for our students in recognition of unselfish service to others and outstanding contributions to the community. I am not retiring only returning to the good life of being a part time teacher. But, our friend Karnac the Magnificent is retiring and wanted to leave you with one last bit.


