## **Chuck Murphy '54 Honored with Marian Award**

Each year the St. Mary's High School Board of Directors recognizes someone for his or her outstanding contributions to the community and unselfish service to others. Exemplifying Mary's supreme faith in Jesus Christ, this person's life serves as a role model to SMHS students. This year's honoree is **Chuck Murphy '54**, the second of four generations of the Murphy family to graduate from SMHS.



Murphy lives his Catholic faith through his community service.

Some of the boards that have benefited from his time and talents are Catholic Charities, Regis University, Pikes Peak Hospice, Silver Key, Julie Penrose Center, Pioneer Museum, and the Fine Arts Center. His willingness to share his business and construction expertise has benefited each organization and enriched the community.

One of Murphy's interests is the history of the Pikes Peak region, and one of his passions is restoring Victorian buildings in the area, such as the former spa in Manitou Springs. But he also helps with modern improvements. When SMHS was building the Grace Center, Murphy's counsel as a member of the Fields Committeewas invaluable as he helped the school navigate the planning process with the city.

Murphy modeled his belief in community service to his children. "He showed me at an early age how important it is to work hard and give back to the community," his son **Brian** '80 said. "Probably not many people know that he was a probation officer and worked in a boys' home before he went to law school. He has always been a caring person."

"We were a close class," said **Shirley Knowles Plush '54**, a member of Murphy's graduating class. "Chuck was fun-loving and everyone's friend, but even then he was a leader. He's done a lot for Colorado Springs."



All five of Chuck and Mary Lou's children attended SMHS.

Besides receiving the Marian Award, Chuck and Mary Lou Murphy were proud grandparents when granddaughter Emily (daughter of Kevin '80 and Sandy Hoelting '83 Murphy) became the first 4th generation Murphy to graduate from SMHS.

# Pirates of Distinction

## FREDERICK IS FULBRIGHT SCHOLAR

Sean Frederick '06, who graduated in



May from the University of Portland with a Bachelor of Science degree in mechanical engineering and a Bachelor of Arts degree in Spanish, was named a Fulbright

Scholar and will be studying for a Master's Degree in Engineering Applications of Lasers at the University of Liverpool in England. The university is a major laser research center.

"[Winning] a major scholarship like the Fulbright opens doors," said Dr. John Orr, Frederick's Honors Program Advisor at the University of Portland. "It's a stamp of a rarified kind of quality,... and networking can occur while spending a year overseas that could prove invaluable down the road."

"It's an intensive one-year program," Frederick stated, "and I'm looking forward to learning something new and different. Lasers are still cutting edge technology, and learning how they can be used in practical ways is intriguing. But I'm also excited about living in and understanding another culture rather than just visiting as a tourist."

Frederick was valedictorian of his University of Portland class, just as he was at St. Mary's, where he was co-valedictorian with **LeAnn Maton**. Frederick could have chosen a number of colleges, but chose the University of Portland, a Holy Cross school, for its strong academic tradition, Catholic standards, small size, and excellent ROTC program.

"I liked the emphasis on ethics, morals, and a diverse world view the school offered," Frederick explained. "My faith was strengthened at the U of P. The faculty made us think deeply about faith, and being on my own without nearby family support forced me to make my own choices. My faith became my own."

Frederick has already been sworn in as a second lieutenant in the United States Air Force, and will be given his first assignment when his year as a Fulbright scholar ends.

#### Three from the Class of 2002 Earn MD degrees

Three members of the St. Mary's class of 2002 graduated from medical school in May, each taking a different road to reach this goal.

Lauren Faricy, valedictorian of her SMHS class, attended Boston College where



she was a Dean's Scholar and earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in English. After graduating with honors a semester early because of high school AP credits, Lauren challenged herself in the Noles wilderness program and then went to Portland, Oregon, to be a part of the Jesuit Volunteer Corps. She worked with homeless youth in a drop-out center and alternative high school. Finding Portland to her liking, she stayed and attended Oregon Health and Science University.

"It has been a fabulous place to train. I've worked with very down-to-earth physicians who are invested in public health and community," Faricy said. "I've had some very strong mentors." Faricy has enjoyed Portland and will be sad to leave this summer, but she is excited to begin her pediatrics residency in Burlington, VT.

Ritter Sansoni headed for warmer weather after graduating from SMHS and



attended Wofford College in Spartanburg, SC. During his undergraduate years he played soccer and three times was named to the Academic All Southern Conference. He also worked during one school year as a nurse assistant. Sansoni graduated magna cum laude from Wofford with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Spanish.

Sansoni chose to stay in the south and attend the Medical University of South Carolina in Charleston. In spite of his

busy schedule, he found time to volunteer as a coach for Special Olympics Soccer Camps, Habitat for Humanity, and the Windwood Farm Boys' Home. He received numerous awards and academic scholarships, and during his third year as a medical student, he was elected to Alpha Omega Alpha Honor Medical Society.

Sansoni is leaving the South for Portland, Oregon, for his residency in Ear, Nose, and Throat Surgery. The northwest will afford him the opportunity to pursue two of his interests, fishing and hunting.

#### First SMHS Rotary Scholar-Athlete of the Year


