# **Suthers Honored**

# Mayor Receives 2016 Marian Award in November Ceremony

uring the course of his career, John Suthers '70 has held many government posts. Currently he is mayor of Colorado Springs, elected in 2015 by an overwhelming majority. He has also served as the district attorney for El Paso and Teller Counties, Colorado Attorney General, and U.S. Attorney for the District of Colorado. Over the years he has received numerous awards, and this November he added to that number when he was presented with St. Mary's Marian Award.

Each year the St. Mary's High School Board of Directors honors a person or couple in recognition of unselfish service to others and outstanding contributions to the community. The award has been presented annually since 2001. Suthers said he was humbled by the recognition.

"I win some awards, a couple every year, and some are more meaningful than others," he said. "This is very meaningful to me. I think it's a recognition of the way I've balanced my Catholicism with public service, which is not an easy thing to do."

### **EARLY INFLUENCES**

Catholic education played a big role in Suthers' becoming the man he is today. Suthers attended Pauline Memorial Parochial School and St. Mary's High School in Colorado Springs, then continued his education on a full scholarship to the University

of Notre Dame. In fact, Suthers said the only career advice he ever received was in the sixth grade when a nun told him that he should become a lawyer because she liked the way he argued.

Suthers said he encountered some limitations in his high school education, such as not having the option to take calculus. But, he said, over time he realized that his Catholic education was very good at developing his writing skills and oral skills, which laid a foundation for his career as a public servant. Even more importantly, he said, were the values he learned through his elementary and secondary education.

"St. Mary's was clearly a value-laden education and I just think I'm a much better person because of it," he said. "I believe that I think about the purpose of life and the meaning of life more than I would have if I had not had that kind of educational background. It

got me focused on why we're here."

He had only been at St. Mary's High School for one year when his father passed away. As a result of that loss, when Suthers returned to school as a sophomore, he grasped the fleeting nature of life better than many of his classmates. Early that year, Latin teacher Sister Georgetta told a story about the "Triumph" ceremony held to honor Rome's conquering heroes; a story that would stick with Suthers the rest of his life.

She explained that for this ceremony, the conquering heroes of each campaign were positioned on chariots by themselves except for one slave standing behind them. It was the slaves job to whisper in the hero's ear 'sic transit gloria mundi,' which means 'quickly passes the glory of the world.' This was to remind the heroes that fame is fleeting, life is short, and the interests of Rome were paramount.

"I was very close to my father. I was 15 years old and had my first stark confrontation with mortality," Suthers said. "I think it was during the first or second week back of our sophomore year and this mortality was very present on my mind. I realized that life was relatively short. Sister Georgetta would go on to talk about making sure you take advantage of your short time on earth to live a meaningful and purposeful life. And that had a huge impact on me. I credit her with a lot of my notions about people's obligations to live their lives in a way that makes them a

good ancestor."

Graduation night was the last time Suthers saw Sister Georgetta. He said as he was leaving the building, Sister Georgetta saw him and said, 'Remember John, *sic transit gloria mundi.*' Over the years, Suthers told that story to family members, and when he was sworn in as district attorney for El Paso and Teller Counties in 1988, which was his first public elected office, his sister gave him a needle point of the saying.

"It's hung in every office I've had since, which is an indication, I think of the influence that my St. Mary's education had on me," Suthers said. "I take it seriously. You have to force yourself to realize that you've got to do the right thing. Character is all that endures; that's the essence of the message. You've got to suffer the slings and arrows day to day but never take your eye off the ball of what has to be done regardless of the criticism that you get."

Another teacher that Suthers said had a profound impact on him was Tom McCeney. McCeney was a history teacher and faculty adviser for student council. Suthers served as student council president his senior year said he loved history, which McCeney made interesting. McCeney was inducted into the St. Mary's Athletic Hall of Fame in October. "He was a very steady figure," Suthers said. "He wrote incredible letters for me that helped me in getting into colleges and in getting scholarships."

### **HUMBLE SERVANT**

Suthers has built on the foundation he received at home and through his Catholic education. Some might think it difficult to have religious beliefs and be an elected public official, but Suthers has found ways to stay strong in his faith while respecting that the separation of church and state is an integral part of our government.

"I've always tried to conduct myself consistent with my public service obligations and oaths of office," Suthers said. "That means I don't make those day-to-day decisions or apply the law from the perspective of my own religious beliefs. But on the other hand, I think my religious beliefs impact how I go about my day-to-day interactions with people and organizations. So the fact that St. Mary's would take the time to recognize me, I'm humbled by that."

St. Mary's Board President Tom Resman said Suthers is an outstanding role model for St. Mary's students and deserving of the Marian Award. In addition to his civil service roles, Resman said Suthers has also served in many Church ministries such as parish council, finance council, and marriage preparation.

"When I met John Suthers for the first time, two qualities stood out above everything else: his life of service and humility," Resman said. "We see these same qualities in Mary, the Mother of God. Despite his prominent roles, Mayor Suthers takes a genuine interest in every person he meets. John is an ethical leader in our community and portrays the Catholic values that he developed as a student in our Catholic schools."

Mike Kloenne, math and engineering teacher, has worked with Suthers on St. Mary's Red Rose Run and Students for Life club. During Suthers' time as mayor, Kloenne said he has watched Suthers build a great team, formulate strategy, and persevere through roadblocks to a successful end.

"Since John's ascent to mayor, I have noticed what a great leader and unifier he has been for our city," Kloenne said. "There is no doubt the biggest impact Mayor Suthers has on our community is through his thoughtful, faith-based leadership. Beyond his superb

leadership, I see Mayor Suthers as a great unifier and peacemaker. Nobody leads by example better than Mayor Suthers."

While there is much that Suthers has accomplished throughout his career, he feels his greatest accomplishment is that when he has left each position, the office he was responsible for was better off than it was when he arrived.

"That really has to be your goal. These are institutions that have been around long before you arrived and will be around long after you leave," he said. "Your mission is to do what you can to improve it while you're there. I've felt very good about that; that the organizations I was in charge of were better off when I left than when I started."

### **FINDING A PATH**

When he was a child, Suthers could not have imagined where his career would take him. After his father died, he said his mother took him to Washington, DC, with her when she was organizing a conference there and they stayed a few extra days to see some of the sites, including the White House and the Supreme Court.

"I've had a very remarkable career. Sometimes I have to pinch myself. Who would have thought that I'd argue a case in the Supreme Court, that I'd be in the front row when some of the biggest Supreme Court cases were argued, that I'd have meetings in the Oval Office or the Roosevelt Room with the President of the United States, or that I'd testify before Congress," Suthers said. "When you're a kid, you just never think those are in store for you. I've had incredible opportunities in the course of my public service and I really do see it as an opportunity as opposed to a sacrifice."

Suthers said he feels his public service has given him a broad perspective on the world, for which he is thankful. He knows that public service, especially going through the election process, isn't for everyone, but he's thankful that good people are willing to endure it and serve in those positions. And, he noted, elected office isn't the only way to serve the community--there are committees and Catholic charities that need workers and organizers.

"I think a person's primary obligation in life is to get the best education you can, get a job that takes care of you so you have a good sense of personal responsibility--you make sure that you always meet whatever obligations you have, when you take on family obligations--then in the context of that base of education and job, you look for opportunities for service," Suthers said. "I think St. Mary's, and Catholic education in general, does a good job of planting in people the notion of how important public service is."

With many public accomplishments, one might think that Suthers would consider his career to be his greatest accomplishment in life, But, if fact, that title goes to his family, including his wife, Janet, and their two daughters, Alison and Kate.

"I made a great choice in marriage. My wife and I have been married 40 years; we're great partners. We've really helped impact the things around us and we've given strength to each other in that regard," he said. "We have two great kids, who, I think, are good servants in their own right. Our oldest, Alison, is deputy DA in Denver, and just had her first child. Kate is a lieutenant commander in the Navy Reserve, and also just had a child. I feel very privileged to have the joyful personal life I've had. I believe it's allowed me to do what I've done. I couldn't have done the public service things without my wife's career. My family and personal life are my source of most joy."

# Funds of the St. Mary's Catholic Education Foundation

### The 1885 Fund

Established at the 125th Anniversary Gala in 2010, the 1885 Fund honors those whose leadership, commitment and dedication have ensured the school's continued success for its first 125 years and beyond. Honorees of the 1885 Fund include the Sisters of Loretto who founded the school in 1885; Monsignors Raber, Kipp, Kelly, and Hoffman, who guided the school as pastors, superintendents and principals; lay leaders such as Leo Smentowski '54, Tom Kelly and Andy Middlemist and, of course, the hundreds of faculty, staff and religious, including Fr. Rawley Myers, who served the school unselfishly over the decades. The fund provides ongoing general operating support of St. Mary's High School.

# The Ertel Family Endowed Scholarship

On an ordinary Friday afternoon in the spring of 2002, Patrick Ertel '68 walked into SMHS and made an extraordinary gift. "I want the school to have this for scholarships for those in need," he said as he handed over an envelope. "These are some investments I inherited from my family. I managed them for some time, but have lost interest in them and have decided that they would be best used for this purpose."

Upon graduating, Ertel entered the seminary, but ultimately discerned that he did not have a calling to the priesthood. His love of the Church and of SMHS, however, continued to grow as he spent the next 35 years in various forms of service to others, first in the Peace Corps and then as a community volunteer. Grateful for the education that he received SMHS,

Ertel decided to create an endowed fund in his family's name. The Ertel Family Endowed Scholarship Fund provides a lasting revenue for financial aid. Ertel hopes to add to the fund in the years ahead.

# The Ernest J. Golobic Endowed Scholarship

Ernest J. Golobic moved to Colorado Springs more than 20 years ago upon retiring from the USPS in Chicago. Though he and his wife, Catherine, had no formal connection to SMHS, they valued Catholic education and began to support the school with yearly gifts to the Annual Fund.

When Mr. Golobic's sister-in-law, Margaret A. Rick, passed away she left him a modest inheritance. To honor his sister-in-law for her generosity and his wife's commitment to Catholic education, Mr. Golobic chose to create the Margaret A. Rick Endowed Memorial Scholarship Fund to support the school's financial aid program. This permanent fund provides the school with revenue to help ensure that SMHS will be available to those in need.

Shortly before his death in 2004, Mr. Golobic contributed some of his own assets to the scholarship fund and, with his daughter's encouragement, changed the name of the fund to The Ernest J. Golobic Family Endowed Scholarship Fund.

# The Ernster-Blichmann Family Endowed Scholarship

Greg Ernster'77 and his wife, Suzanne Blichmann Ernster, parents of Lauren'06 and Paul'08, established the Ernster-Blichmann Family Endowed Scholarship to provide need-based tuition assistance to students, particularly those interested in math, the sciences, sports, and/or debate. When possible, the gifts follow the receiving students for their entire time at SMHS so long as their need is proven to the Foundation each year.

### The Tom Kelly Scholarship Fund

The St. Mary's Catholic Education Foundation has established the Tom Kelly Scholarship Fund in memory of Tom Kelly, who faithfully served the St. Mary's High School community as a member of the school board, foundation board, and in advisory capacity for more than 25 years. The fund benefits scholarship and financial aid programs of St. Mary's High School."

### **The Clergy Fund**

The St. Mary's Catholic Education Foundation established the Clergy Fund to assist with the funding of the clergy office at St.

Mary's High School, including the salary of a school chaplain and supplies needed to carry out the mission of the office.

### **Anna Stevens Scholarship Fund**

A local community volunteer and philanthropist, Anna Stevens desired to leave a lasting legacy through her estate. As part of her estate plan, she established the Anna Stevens Scholarship Fund to provide need-based tuition assistance to St. Mary's High School students.

### The Good Sisters Fund

Named in honor of Srs. Valerie and Ann Monica Pierce, the Good Sisters Fund supplements funding of the school's curriculum and teacher development. Each semester, the departments heads submit grant requests to the principal for funding of curriculum or programs that would not otherwise be available. The principal prioritizes the requests for the Foundation board which, pursuant to the Fund, awards \$1,500 per semester in grants.

In creating the Fund, Sr. Valerie hoped that it grow through additional gifts from SMHS families, friends, and alumni.

### **The Tafolla Family Fund**

Patrice and Jerry Tafolla established the Tafolla Family Fund endowment in gratitude for all SMHS has provided their family, including an excellent education for their daughter, Sarah '13, and son, Michael '15. Their association with the school is a lifelong relationship rooted in faith, community, and a sense of belonging.

The Tafolla Family Fund is a legacy gift, providing permanent funding for debt relief and tuition assistance. At the end of each fiscal year, 5 percent of the balance of the fund is available to the school for the following school year.

The Tafollas intend to be lifelong supporters of SMHS, through the Annual Fund and events like the Golf Classic and the Gala, and by adding to the endowment fund. They encourage other families to consider a gift that will provide for the financial future of the school.

# 3 Individuals, 2 Teams inducted to Athletic Hall of Fame

The induction ceremonies are special as athletes, coaches, and supporters reminesce about what being a Pirate has meant in their lives. This year's ceremony saw not only three individuals inducted into the Hall of Fame, but also recognized the first two of four Exemplary Sports Teams to be enshrined as well.

The class of 2016 inductees were Thomas McCeney, teacher and Pirate supporter; William Mullane, coach and teacher; and Jim Smith '72, basketball. A total of four Exemplary Sports Teams will be enshrined this year with two honored at the Hall of Fame induction—the 1956 hockey team and the 1962 football team. The 1933-1934 and 1960-1961 basketball teams will be enshrined at the Pirate basketball games on Feb. 4. (Learn more about these exemplary basketball teams in our Spring/Summer 2017 issue.)

# **Exemplary Teams: Hockey**

After starting off the season with a loss, the 1956 hockey team went undefeated for the rest of the season to capture the Colorado Springs High School Hockey League title, which also served as the state title that year.

Representing the 1956 hockey team were Jerry Varrone '57, Ken Stwertnik '56, and Craig Hart '57. Varrone said the team attributes its success that year to being inspired. While coaches provided a lot of inspiration, Varrone said Father Freudenstein, who helped secure new uniforms for the team, served as inspiration as well.

"Father Freudenstein was an inspiration to all of us because he was so dedicated to the team," Varrone said.

Hart said the team proved it could still win on 50th anniversary of the game.

"We played a game against men in their mid-40s," he said. "We beat them 8-4 for our 16th win in a row."

# **Exemplary Teams: Football**

The 1962 football Pirates became the first team in the history of St. Mary's High School to win 10 games, capture a league title outright, and play in a state championship game. That season Richie Jewett '63 rushed for more than 1,330 yards, and Larry Peralta '63 rushed for more than 880 yards. The defense allowed only 117 points to be scored in 12 games; they recorded four shutouts and forced 50 turnovers.

Coach Chuck Haering said that year the team needed each and every player on the team to accomplish what it did.

"I've been a coach for 50 years now and the most devoted, most dedicated, most focused players I've ever had were at St. Mary's," he said. "Those St. Mary's players became the measuring stick by which I assessed all of my future players."

# **Thomas McCeney**

McCeney, known as Mr. Mac during his time at St. Marys, was posthumously inducted into the Hall of Fame. Accepting for him was Garitt Griebel '61, who was both a student and colleague of McCeney.

Griebel said McCeney's dedication to St. Mary's students makes him deserving of the honor. Throughout his time at St. Mary's, McCeney taught, was student advisor, served as counselor, and served as administrator. He also co-founded the Men's Club for Athletics, which supported Pirate athletics and helped procure uniforms.

"Mr. Mac knew that students needed both scholastic pursuits and physical development," Griebel said. "He is richly deserving of this award for the kind, scholarly, generous, devoted, and humorous example of excellence that he set for all who knew him."

In receiving the award, Mullane thanked all of those he worked with at St. Mary's, including the priests, sisters, and faculty, more making St. Mary's great.

# Jim Smith, Basketball

Smith was the second leading scorer in basketball in the 1972 Will Rogers League and played in the Pirates football defeat of Harrison High School, which is considered one of the Pirates biggest upsets.

Smith said his love of Pirate sports started during his days at Divine Redeemer. Smith's older brother was already attending St. Mary's and in supporting the school Smith said he got to watch some of the finest athletes around.
