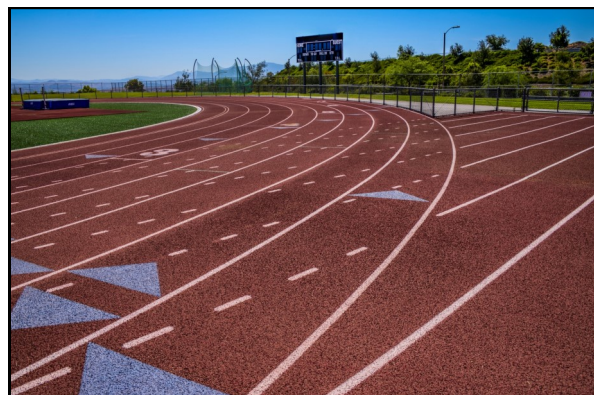

On January 6th both girls and boys played the Colcord Hornets at home, both games ended in a loss with the boys losing 80-61, and the girls 59-49. On the 10th both teams played Wyandotte at home; the boys lost 51-41 and the girls came out with a 54-45 victory. On the 13th both teams played the Ketchum warriors at Ketchum and the boy's game ended with a 48-73 defeat. The girls ended in a 56-24 victory. On the 17th both
