## A REPORT FROM COLUMBUS U.S.D. #493 DECEMBER 14, 2020 REGULAR BOARD MEETING

### **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

The board recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

### **ADOPT AGENDA AS PRESENTED**

The board voted to adopt the agenda as presented.

### **APPROVE CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS**

The board voted to approve the consent agenda items including the minutes of November 11, 2020 board meeting, the bills due and payable in the amount of \$194,078.04, and Treasurer's Report as presented.

### **EARLY GRADUATION PROPOSAL**

Dan Grundy presented a proposal to allow high school seniors an option to develop a plan with teacher assistance to graduate a semester early. The board took the matter under consideration for a later time.

### **AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM**

The board voted to approve the second semester after school program as presented.

### **TECHNOLOGY COMPLIANCE ON CIPA FOR ERATE**

The board adopted a motion certifying that USD #493 has (and will) complied (past, present, and future) with the requirements of CIP (Children's Internet Protection Act).

### **POSSIBLE BOND ELECTION FOR CENTRAL CAMPUS**

Brian Smith presented a plan to move forward in the spring with a possible May 2021 bond election for the Central campus. The consensus of the board was favorable to move forward.

### **COVID-19 MITIGATION PLAN AMENDMENT**

The board voted to amend the COVID-19 Mitigation Plan wording to include "all teachers, staff and students while in school buildings are subject to county orders pertaining to personal protective equipment (PPE) and mask. Reusable mask may be provided by the district".

### **PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT**

Brian Smith presented a professional development waiver that KSDE voted to allow that would help districts meet the hour requirements using professional development time. The board took the matter under consideration for a later time.

### **ACCEPT RESIGNATION**

The board voted to accept the resignation of DaCoda Murdock as CUHS Assistant Basketball Coach.

### **NEW HIRE**

The board voted to hire Ellenora Yockey as Central Evening Custodian.
