Clinton Elementary (in accordance with CDC guidelines / due to COVID-19) will utilize alternative modes (when applicable) to communicate with parents in order to increase parent involvement and to support classroom instruction by:

- Teachers will routinely contact parents on an individual basis to communicate about their child's progress via traditional and virtual methods.
- The school will use the student handbook, school/class web sites, signage at the school entrance, and parent orientation meetings to display information regarding the school-wide plan.
- The school will communicate routinely with parents using Facebook, Thrillshare, PBIS Rewards, school-wide call-outs, school website, and daily communication folders.
- A daily communication folder/notebook will be utilized to provide two way communication between parent/guardian and teacher. Classroom teacher will send home a folder containing student papers, work samples, and teacher/school communication notification. Parents will be asked to sign the communication sheet in the folder and send it back to school.
- The classroom teachers provide parents with an interim report every 4 ½ weeks, and report cards every 9 weeks with information regarding their child's academic progress. For more information contact 501-833-1200.
 Two parent teacher conference days are scheduled, one per semester to discuss student's progress, standardized test scores, and an explanation of the interventions teachers are using to assist the child in reaching achievement goals. Parents will be asked to engage in discussion of how they can support these efforts. Conferences for this school year are tentatively scheduled for the 2022-2023 school year.
