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# What is a Title One School?

We were deemed a Title One school last year (2019-2020) and the government determines which schools are eligible based on the percentage of students that live on or below the poverty line. Title I funds are being used as a school-wide program so all students are eligible for Title I services.

School is in the bottom fifth percentile--based on the adjusted NSPF index score.

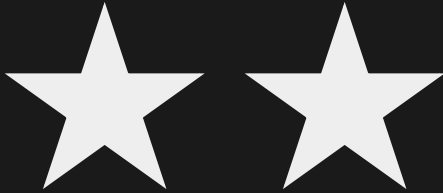
School received a 1-Star rating on the NSPF

# What is the Goal of Title 1?

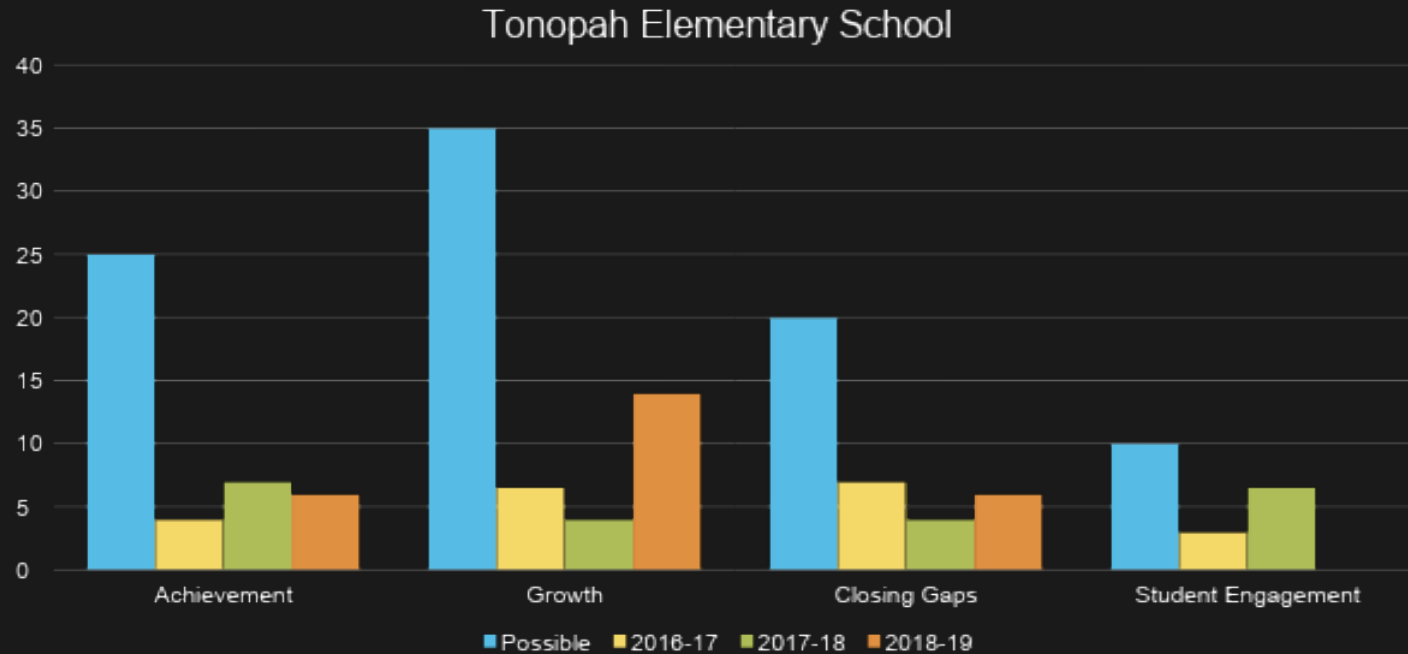
To ensure a high quality education for EVERY student!

- We are your partner in assisting your student to succeed!!

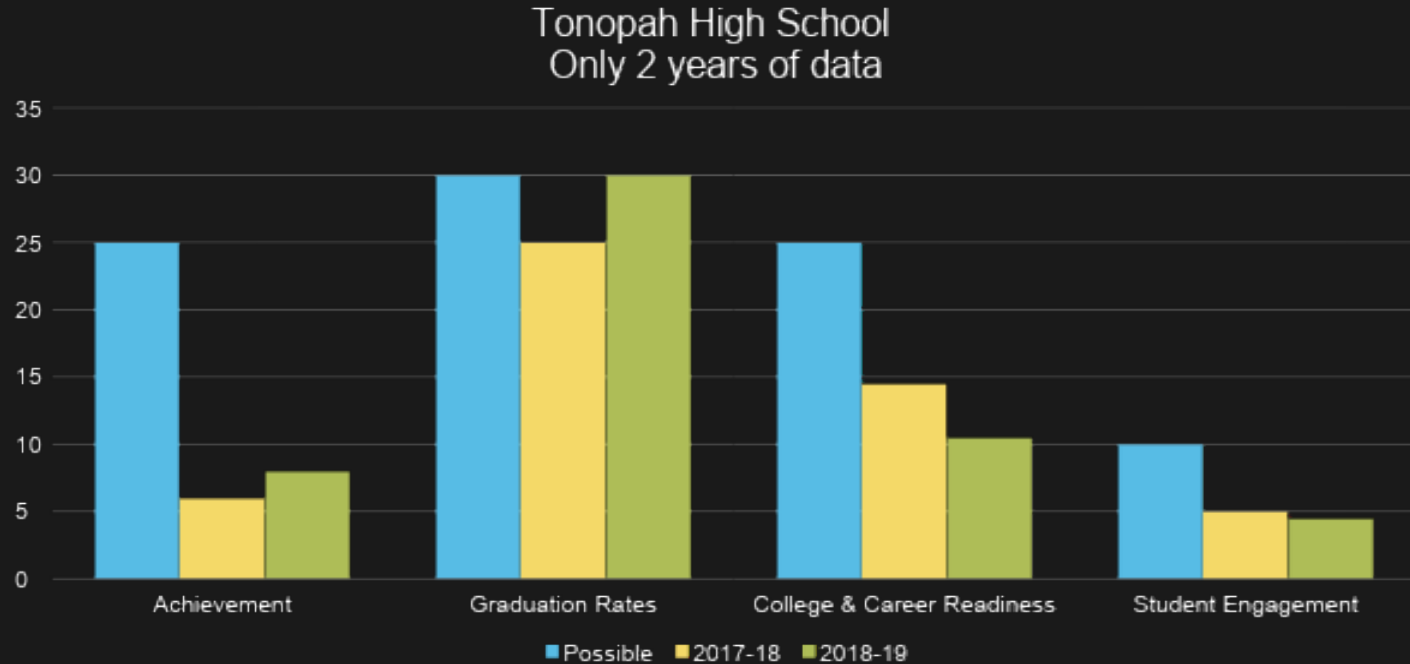
# Nevada School Performance Framework

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# Tonopah Elementary School Performance Plan--Goal 1

## Tonopah Elementary

By May 2021, Tonopah Elementary School will increase student engagement in all classrooms and all subjects to 80% as measured by learning walks with teachers and administrators with an overarching goal of 95% by 2025.

## Action Steps

1. To empower teachers to develop and implement (in the classroom) PD based on increasing student engagement at all levels.
2. Increasing positive student engagement in all subjects will result in improved attendance.
3. Implementation of teacher generated and agreed upon engagement strategies in all classrooms and subject areas.

# Tonopah High School Performance Plan--Goal 1

## Tonopah High School

By May 2021, Tonopah High School will increase student engagement in all classrooms and all subjects to 80% as measured by learning walks with teachers and administrators with an overarching goal of 95% by 2025.

# Tonopah Elementary School Performance Plan--Goal 2

## Tonopah Elementary

By May of 2021, Tonopah Elementary will increase the number of students achieving a level 3 or higher on the SBAC by 10% which will lead to an increase in median growth in both math and reading.

## Action Steps

1. Provide focused and sustained PD on best teaching practices. Provide PD on how to use and analyze NWEA and Lexia data to drive instruction.
2. All teachers will use intervention plan data to update parents on specific skills taught in class, formal and summative assessments occurring, and provide strategies/resources on how to reinforce skills being taught in the classroom.
3. All teachers will conduct student-led conference times during fall and spring conference times where teachers will explain student progress on essential reading and math skills.
4. At end of every unit in math and reading teachers will provide individualized notifications to parents of students, below the 70th%, on unit assessments providing information on their strengths and weaknesses and how to support that learning at home.
5. Use intervention data tracking forms to monitor and analyze improvement in math and reading instruction to meet the needs of every student.

# Tonopah High School Performance Plan--Goal 2

## Tonopah High School

By February of 2021, we will increase the composite score of students taking the ACT by 1.5 points.

### Action Steps

1. PD regarding intervention options available for all students.
2. ACT Prep PD for Teachers
3. Communication with families regarding student progress in intervention programs.
4. Communication with families regarding upcoming test dates for ACT.
5. Verification and Monitoring of data sources.

# Tonopah Elementary School Performance Plan--Goal 3

## Tonopah Elementary

By February of 2021, we will decrease the number of students in the 1st to 40th quintile by 5 percent.

## Action Steps

1. PD regarding intervention options available for all students.
2. PD on intervention plan documentation.
3. Communication with families regarding intervention and student progress.
4. Verification and Monitoring of intervention data tracking.

# Tonopah High School Performance Plan--Goal 3

## Tonopah High School

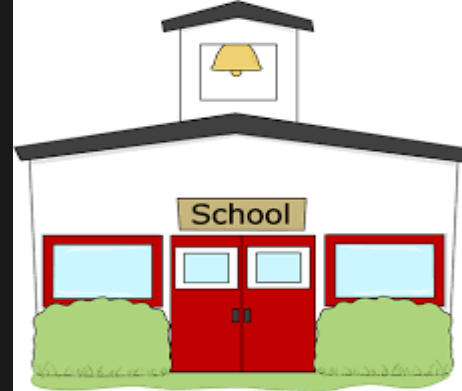
Students will demonstrate the ability to earn an Advanced or College and Career Ready diploma by completing all of the required honors and advanced placement courses in math, science, social studies, English Language Arts, and electives by May of 2023, with a increase of 5% per academic year.

## Action Steps

1. AP teachers will be streamed from other schools within NCSD to provide AP and Honors level course work for students and will attend relevant professional development to ensure best practices are being used in the classroom setting.
2. Families will be invited to attend an annual AP/Honors courses night.
3. AP and Honors courses instructors will maintain a high level of rigor within their instruction.

# As a school, what must we do?

- Identify students most in need of educational assistance and design intervention to assist those students
- Measure and report student progress on State Standards and testing
- Involve parents in our schools
