Enrollment is steady. We have not lost or gained from last month.

- Jr. High – 118 students
- High School – 103 students

In the school:

- Spring break is almost upon us. Students and teachers are looking forward to the break.
 - State Knowledge bowl is going on March 12 & 13th. This is in Fort Collins, CO, and our varsity team qualified for state this year. They are representing Rangely in an outstanding fashion this year. They have been the only team to beat Steamboat so far this year.
 - Our Boys and Girls basketball teams represented well at regionals. The Boys did not advance beyond regionals, but our Girls were the Region 4 champions. They went on to state and represented very well. They lost their first game to Wray, won their second game against the number 2 team Simla, and then lost in the consolation championships to Holyoke. This was an outstanding group of girls and I want to congratulate them on an outstanding year and season.
 - Jr. High Wrestling will be hosting the Western Slope championships here in Rangely this Saturday, March 17th. Right now it appears that we will have 13 schools plus a few additional individuals coming in. We will run 3 mats and will have a full day of wrestling.
 - Once we get back from Spring Break, we will be preparing for the State Tests. We will have the CMAS tests, as well as the SAT series tests. Teachers are working hard to have our kids prepared and ready for the tests.
 - FBLA will be taking 7 kids on to State in April where they will compete.
 - Prom and Rowdy worm will be the weekend of April 14th.
