9.A Old business

A.1 Graduation Requirements

CASB will have a draft policy out soon so we are waiting to see what the language will be.

A.2 Kindergarten

Matt shared the results of a survey with the board for their review and stated that he will continue to get more feedback. He stated, with the numbers he presented, it will not be feasible to have an option of full-day or half-day kindergarten. Will continue to work on this and keep the board informed. The board agreed to have the next work session, Tuesday, April 5th, to discuss further.

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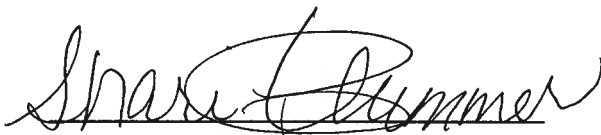

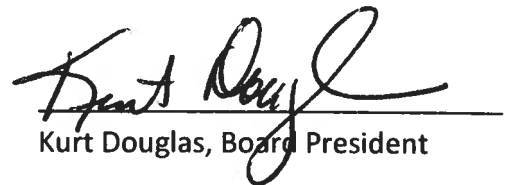
