We also want to remind families that when school resumes on January 5, 2021, Kindergarten through 5th grades will continue to come to school 5 days per week. Students in grades 6-12 will continue on Plan B (hybrid A-B schedule) which means they will attend brick and mortar school two days per week and the other days they will be eLearning. We will also continue the earlier dismissal that was started after Thanksgiving. Given CDC changes to quarantine procedures, fluctuating numbers of active cases in the county, and the coming vaccine, the School Board will revisit the reopening plan and consider changes on January 12, 2021.
