

USD 358 Oxford Return to School Flowchart

(Following a COVID-19 Related Absence) UPDATED 1-3-2021

USD 358 Follows SUMNER COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT'S GUIDANCE

Scenario 1

Student/Staff had a close contact with someone who tested positive or is suspected of having COVID-19

May Return After: a **10 day** quarantine period from the date of the **LAST CONTACT** with individual and does not develop symptoms. If the positive person lives in the same household- the student/staff member's- If the positive person is able to quarantine AWAY from others- for instance stays in a basement area way from everyone else- the 10 days starts on the last day of contact. **If that is not possible, the 10 day count does not start UNTIL THE POSITIVE person's isolation period is over.**

Scenario 2

Student/Staff tested positive or is suspected of having COVID-19 **AND** had symptoms

May return AFTER:
1. At least **10 days** have passed since symptom onset AND
2. At least 72 hours since resolution of fever and symptoms greatly improve (with the exception of lingering cough)



Scenario 3

Student/Staff tested positive for COVID-19 **but had NO symptoms**

May return AFTER:
At least **10 days** have passed since date of first positive COVID-19 test and symptoms have not developed during 10-day period, follow the criteria from Scenario 2

Due to changing guidelines, this document will evolve as updated guidance from CDC, KDHE, or Local Health Dept. is provided.

Scenario 4

Student/staff exhibits one or more symptoms of COVID-19- but isn't suspected of having COVID-19

Some Examples: Seasonal Allergies, Ear Infections, Seasonal Flu, Strep Throat, Migraines, ETC. It may be possible to return in less than **10 days after onset of symptoms and fever free 24 hours ONLY** If there is evidence of an alternative reason for the symptoms: example a note from a doctor.

Scenario 5

Student/Staff returns from travel area or activity restricted by KDHE

May return AFTER: **14 day quarantine** from date of return trip and asymptomatic

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
