Happy New Year! I hope that the adults in your household had some well-deserved relaxation over break, and your children got a chance to just play. This month we honor Martin Luther King Jr. who said, "Only when it's dark enough can you see the stars." After the challenging times we've collectively faced, and continue to face, his message of hope feels important.

I am lucky, as your elementary school counselor, to be constantly reminded of the natural joy and resilience of children. Today, in some zoom meetings with students both fully remote, and some attending hybrid, I asked students about what school things were making them happy right now. They said things like, "I get to do math and writing," getting to "do races" outside at recess, and "Getting to learn new things, like science." Some students said they liked doing work on Seesaw, many talked about liking art. Today a 1st grader said, "I'm excited about doing math and coloring in things." These examples of students' enthusiasm help keep me grounded and optimistic despite the challenges.

School Attendance During COVID

This year, some of our state attendance guidelines have been different due to COVID-19 and remote learning. Here are some helpful guidelines for understanding attendance during the pandemic:

What do I do if my child isn't feeling well?

- Contact the office to excuse an absence when your child is not feeling well and will not be attending school (in-person or on-line)

Hybrid Students

- What counts as attendance?
 - Attending school in-person on their cohort days.
 - Completing assigned work and/or attending a Zoom meeting on their offcampus days.
- When should I keep my child home from school?
 - If they have a temperature of 100.4 or more.
 - Frequent coughing and/or sneezing that is not associated with allergies or asthma.
 - If they are vomiting, have diarrhea and/or a sudden change in appetite.

- What if my child is not well enough to attend school in person but is feeling well enough to complete online work?
 - With the current attendance guidelines, we are able to go back up to 5 school days to change an absence to "Present" based on student work completion.

Remote Students

- What counts as attendance?
 - Attending Zoom meetings, completing assigned work and/or attending teacher office hours.
- What if my child is a remote student and misses a Zoom meeting but is feeling well enough to complete work?
 - With the current attendance guidelines, we are able to go back up to 5 school days to change an absence to "Present" based on student work completion.
