# State requirements for graduation: State Tests

## Testing: 3 Pathways

1. Earn a cumulative score of 18 on EOCs
  - a. English I and II, Algebra, Geometry, Biology, Am. History, Am. Government
  - b. We will help you prep for these tests, so take it seriously and do your best!!
2. Earn “remediation free” scores on ACT
  - a. English 18 or higher
  - b. Math 22 or higher
  - c. Reading 22 or higher
3. Earn 12 points on industry recognized credential i.e. cosmetology license
  - a. Earn a 13 on a WorkKeys assessment

OR

1. Earn a 684 on the Algebra I and English II EOCs and Show Readiness (see requirements for Readiness below)

# Class Rank

- Weighted vs Unweighted classes
  - **Non-Weighted Scale**
    - A = 4.0 GPA Value
    - B = 3.2 GPA Value

## **Weighted Scales**

A = 5.0 GPA Value

B = 4.2 GPA Value

- All Advanced Placement classes and many Dual Credit courses are weighed on a 5.0 scale

# What happens if I fail a course?!

# Scheduling for Senior Year

- Meet with your counselor if you are unsure what classes you need to take senior year in order to graduate
- **Athletic Eligibility**
  - All athletes must pass 5 one-credit courses in the preceding grading period
  - All student-athletes should be enrolled in 6 classes just in case you fail a class



# How to Schedule

- Meet with your core teachers to go over what you should take next year
- Mark it down on your registration form
- Login to your HAC account
- Click on classes
- Click on requests
- Find the courses you went over with your teachers and select each one (make sure to save)
- Make sure the course code on your paper matches up with the one you selected in your HAC

# Schedule Change Policy

Changes in a student's schedule will only be considered for the following reasons:

- Change into a career/technical program
- Master schedule conflict between classes chosen in the spring
- Two or more study halls or no study halls
- Lacking a course needed to graduate
- Changes due to summer-school enrollment
- Conflicts with post-secondary enrollment
- Change a study hall to an office aide
- Obvious error in schedule

\*All other requests outside these parameters must be submitted to and approved by an administrator.\*

Changes in a student's high school schedule will *not* be considered for the following reasons:

- To change the student's lunch
- To have classes with friends
- Student or parent desire for another instructor
- Student requested the course but no longer desires it



# Honors Contract

## Expectations:

1. I understand these classes are designed to prepare me for success in college and careers.
2. I understand the commitment of time and dedication I will make by selecting advanced courses for next school year. I should expect nightly and weekend homework in these classes. This work will include outside reading, research, project development, essays, and reflective writing.
3. I understand I may be required to complete summer work for one or more of these classes. If I do not complete summer assignments, I am aware this will have a negative impact on my grades. I also understand that by not doing the summer assignment, I will not be dropped from the course.
4. I understand if I drop a face-to-face CCP course, I will remain in the course as a non-CCP student for the remainder of the semester. I understand that I can only drop AP or honors courses at the semester, and only if approved by an administrator.
5. I understand that all AP students are required to take the AP test or complete the AP portfolio.
6. I understand that I must be mindful of the total number of advanced courses I schedule in any school year to give myself the opportunity to be successful.



# Graduation Distinction

- Summa Cum Laude – Weighted GPA of 4.00 or above
- Magna Cum Laude – Weighted GPA of 3.75 to 3.99
- Cum Laude – Weighted GPA of 3.50 to 3.74

## Honors Diploma

- 4 credits of english, math, science, social studies
- 3 years of the same foreign language or 4 years of 2 different foreign languages
- 3.5 gpa on a 4.0 scale or 27 on the ACT
