














Vision

Who We Serve

K-8th grade youth in the Wautoma Area School District service area (*Including youth* attending homeschool, online and private schools)

Priority is given to:

- Youth who would benefit from being in the program as identified by school day staff
- Previously enrolled youth and their siblings
- Youth who can attend 4 or more days per week on average

Program Results

ENROLLMENT & ATTENDANCE:

- 24% (214 youth) of K-8 students in the WASD enrolled (increase of 36 (4%))
- 134 students attended A+ each day on average (increase of 9)
- 91% (195 youth) were regular attendees (30+ days) (increase of 41 (9%))
- 68% were frequent attendees (90+ days) (decrease of 1%)
- On average, regular attendees attended 115 days of A+ (increase of 6)
- 172 days of programming were offered (increase of 12 days)





PARENT SURVEYS: 71% return rate


- 95% of families reported their child enjoyed attending most or all of the time.

Spring 2022 Teacher Perception Survey Results




Overall what happened with the students engagement in learning over the course of the school year?


