All students work independently by using online curriculum and classes are self-paced per semester and distance learning. Classes are through the Zoom platform Monday through Thursday from 2:00 pm to 7:00 pm and on Friday from 9:00 am until 2:00 pm. Alternative students are age 16-22 and Adult students are 18 and older. Free and reduced lunch is available in our evening program. All teachers are highly qualified in each of the core curriculum.



2019-20 Audit Report

On October 15th, the Swan Valley Board of Education approved the 2019-20 audit of the district by Gardner, Provenzano, Thomas, and Luplow, P.C. The 2019-20 school year ended with a general fund surplus of \$365,274 increasing the fund balance to \$2,750,614 or 15.5 % of general fund expenditures. It was recommended the fund balance be approximately 10% -15% of general fund expenditures.

Swan Valley Learning Center is a fully licensed year-round program that provides before and after school care, as well as a full and part-time preschool program.

Our preschool program focuses on pre-skills, which lay the groundwork for the future. Through their playing, singing and learning, preschoolers gain skills that ultimately help them learn to read, write, build math, science skills, and become successful students. Preschoolers also learn "school readiness" skills, which help them understand the routines of school, how to work in groups, and how to be students.

Preschool classrooms are organized by centers or areas that are divided by different developmental areas and types of play. Centers available include: reading, arts, crafts, water/sand table, building, math toys, fine motor skills toys, large motor skills toys, and an area for pretend play. The preschool day is structured with both academic and free play time, during which children can choose which centers to play in, as well as a structured scheduled time devoted to academics.

During our before school program, we provide a nutritional balanced breakfast daily, with a variety of hot and cold choices to ensure they start their day out right. After school we allow time for our children to work on their homework. Our Program has iPads and computers available for the children to use to further their learning through educational apps and websites. The children also have time to be with their friends. Any child who meets the age requirement (3-12) and is enrolled in the Swan Valley District may attend. We also accept non-resident students. Transportation is provided to and from Havens Elementary and Shields Elementary during the school year. Hours of operation are 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Our certified and enthusiastic team is dedicated to providing the best care for your child. With licensed teachers on staff at all times, we are sure to enhance your child's experience while they are away from home.


Baby Hats For Sale

As students work through the Earning Power module in the Financial Literacy curriculum, Xello will help Swan Valley Students get a deeper, more thorough understanding of their choices, which will increase their chances of making the best decisions for them. As students work with this program, they begin to see the impact of making informed choices not only to their eventual happiness, but to their financial bottom line as well.



On September 9th, we were told we could practice and compete INDOORS! We scrambled to fill our 18 competition dates so that we could make the most out of our shortened season. Our goal was to make it to district finals. After one of our starters was told to quarantine, we had to make some quick adjustments. A change in lineup didn't stop these athletes. They were determined to win, and they did just that. They brought home that district title defeating Chesaning in 3 games. They gave it their all and made it to regional finals the following week. Even though they didn't win, they played with heart.

Five of our athletes received Tri-Valley Conference Division awards and one received All-Region recognition. Senior Rachel Joslyn was awarded First Team All-Conference along with All-Region honors.
