#### **Locations & Grades Served**

Wautoma Area School District:

- Parkside School (4-8 grade)
- Redgranite Elementary (K-5 grade)
- Riverview Elementary (K-3 grade)

#### **Who We Serve**

K-8th grade youth in the Wautoma Area School District service area (*Includes* homeschool, online and private schools)

Priority is given to:

- Previously enrolled youth and their siblings
- Youth that can attend 4 or more days per week on average
- Youth identified by school day staff as needing extra services
- Youth that would benefit by participating in the program

#### **Program Activities**

A+ offers a variety of activities daily including:

- Enrichment Activities (Academic, STEM, Art, Physical Activity and Life Skills)
- Homework Help and Tutoring
- Snack
- Recreation
- Free Choice Activities

Other activities and events offered include:

- Field Trips
- Family Events
- Adult Enrichment

#### **Team Members**

Team Members include: certified teachers, paraprofessionals, parents, grandparents, community members, local professionals, high school students and middle school students.

- 31 paid part-time employees
- 35 volunteers
- 10 local organizations

### History

In 2000 a group of community members, parents and district staff recognized the need for an after school program in the Wautoma Area School District. A+ has evolved over the years from primarily providing homework and a safe place to be, to including enrichment, youth leadership, tutoring, field trips, parent education, quarterly celebrations, competitions and community involvement.

Parkside received a 5 year 21CCLC Grant (\$480,000). The school district and Fund 80 continued to support the Redgranite and Riverview Programs.

A+ celebrated 15 years of After School Programming! SAGE Funding ended for A+. Title 1 was leveraged to provide funding for Redgranite.

Riverview School received a 5 year 21CCLC Grant (\$300,000).

Parkside & Redgranite programs continued with school support.

WHS was not selected for a continuation grant. WHS continued offering academic support after school 2 days a week.

The first A+ Summer Camp programs were offered in June funded by donations, fees & Title 4.

Riverview received a 3rd 5 year 21CCLC grant (\$250,000).

The first A+ Spring Break Camp was offered in March. Riverview was awarded a 5 year 21CCLC grant. (\$650,000).

The Reach The Peak Race fundraiser was created to provide sustainability.
Wautoma High School received a 5 year 21CCLC Grant (\$300,000).

## Program Results

#### **ENROLLMENT & ATTENDANCE:**

- 27% of K-8 students in the WASD enrolled (243 youth) increase of 41 from 18/19
- 166 students attended A+ each day on average increase of 32 from 18/19
- 87% were regular attendees (30+ days) \*6% decrease from 18/19
- 46% were frequent attendees (90+ days) \*22% decrease from 18/19
- On average, regular attendees attended 88 days of A+ \*decrease of 24 from 18/19
- 116 days of programming were offered compared to 159 in 18/19 \*decrease 43
   \*decrease is directly related to school shutdown due to COVID19



#### **PARENT SURVEYS: 30% return rate**

\*5% lower than 18/19

- 86% of parents felt the after school program reduced stress at home.
- 89% of families felt the A+ program helped their family not worry about their child's safety after school.
- 96% of families believe that A+ Staff built positive relationships with their child.
- The percent of A+ families that agree or strongly agree that A+ helped their child...
  - Improve academic skills: 77%
  - Improve social skills: 86%
  - Improve health / healthy choices: 83%
  - Develop new skills and interests: 89%
  - Build self-confidence: 80%
  - Make new friends: 88%

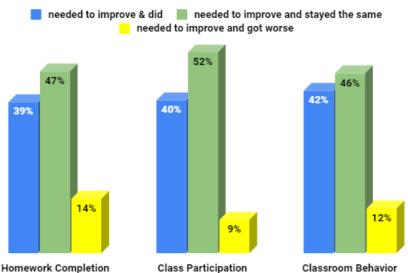
#### **ACADEMICS:**

#### **TEACHER SURVEYS:**

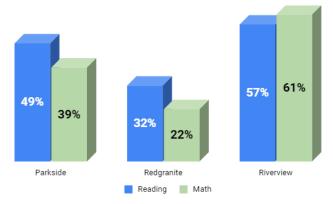

#### iReady Academic Growth Results:



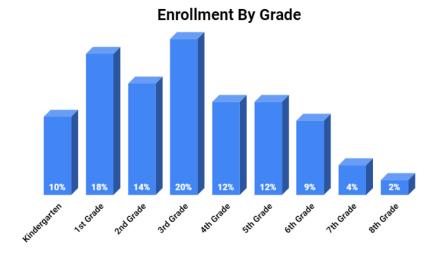

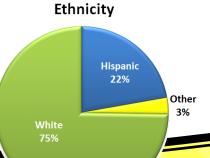

#### **Objectives and Results for 2019-20:**

#### **Academic Goals:**

At least 65% of regular attendees will meet or exceed 50% of their projected typical growth goal on the iReady Math / Reading Assessment from Fall 2019 to Winter 2020. \*modified due to school shutdown.

Reading: 49%Math: 39%

Teachers will report improvement in homework completion for at least 50% of regular attendees that needed to improve in homework completion per the Spring Teacher Survey.

#### **Participation Goals:**

80 or more students will attend at least once.

• 84 (increase of 21 students from 18/19)

75 students or more will regularly attend the PS A+ Program.

• 72 students attended 30 or more days. (increase of 17 students from 18/19)

90% or more of regular attendees will participate in one or more health and fitness enrichments.

• 51% participated in at least one fitness enrichment (decrease 49% from 18/19)

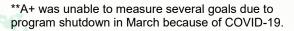
70% or more of RA will have no detentions logged during the school year.

#### Family Engagement Goals:

- 19 family members attended at least 2 family events (decrease by 3 from 18/19)
- 51% of enrolled students had at least 1 family member attend at least 1 event this year. (decrease of 9% from 18/19)

#### **Objectives and Results for 2019-20:**

#### **Academic Goals:**

70% of frequently attending youth (90+ days) identified as below proficiency in math / reading will meet or exceed 50% of their annual typical growth on the iReady Math / Reading Assessments from Fall 2019 to Winter 2020. (modified due to school shutdown)

- Reading: 37% met or exceeded their growth goal
- Math: 26% met or exceeded their growth goal

At least 50% of frequent attendees (90+ days) in need of improvement in homework completion will have teacher reported improvements on homework completion on the Spring Teacher Survey.

40% (of students that needed to improve)





#### **Participation Goals:**

60 students or more will attend the CLC

- 60 students (increase of 9 from 18/19
- 45 students or more will regularly attend (30+ days) the A+ Program:
- 48 students were regular attendees (increase of 2 from 18/19)

#### **Family Engagement Goals:**

50 family members or more will attend 1 (one) or more CLC family engagement offerings:

- 32 family members attended one or more family events. (decrease of 3 from 18/19)
- 17 families attended 2 or more events. (increase of 3 from 18/19)
- 47% of students had at least 1 family member attend at least 1 event this year! (decreased 28% from 18/19)

90% of adults with youth in A+ will report that services satisfactorily met their family's specific needs.

- 100% of those that completed the Spring End of Year Family Survey.
- \*\*A+ was unable to measure several goals due to program shutdown in March because of COVID-19.
- \*Many decreases can be attributed to the school shutdown in March, many family events and health programs did not take place.

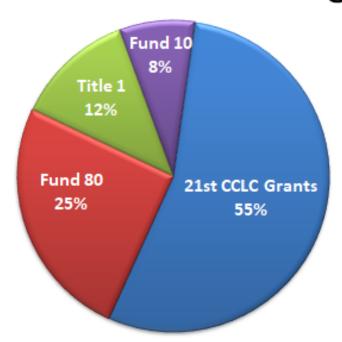

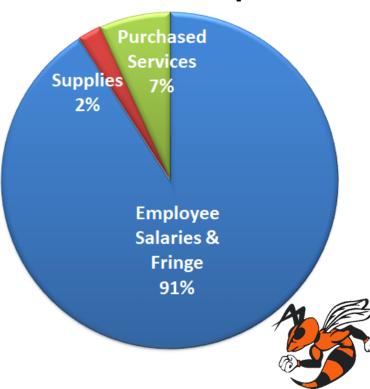
