

2023-2024 Dress and Grooming Rules

- Modesty is key.
- Clothes must be non-revealing.
- Clothes must be clean, fitted properly, and worn in the correct manner.
- Clothes must be non-distracting to the learning/classroom environment.
- Hair should be neat, clean, well-groomed, and styled so vision will not be obstructed.
- Sunglasses should not be worn in the building.
- Facial hair is acceptable if neatly groomed/trimmed.
- Students may not cut or shave designs in their hair or eyebrows.
- Headbands are permissible **except** for bandanas, doo rags, or headgear with gang related marking/coloring.
- Head coverings cannot be worn in the building (e.g. caps/beanies/hoods).
- Tops must be long enough to cover the midsection when standing or seated.
- No midriffs, tank tops, spaghetti straps, or sleeveless tops.
- No sheer/crocheted tops that reveal underclothing or sleeveless shirts.
- Undergarments (bras/bralettes/etc.) and cleavage should not be visible.
- Shirts cannot have any obscene, graphic, or gang related designs.
- Bottoms must be worn at the hips with no sagging (belts used when necessary).
- Holes in pants must be below fingertip length. If holes are above fingertip length, leggings must be worn underneath.
- Skirts and shorts must be fingertip length **all** the way around.
- Leggings must be worn with a covering garment (top/blouse/shirt). The covering garment must be fingertip length.
- Shoes must be worn at all times.
- Shoes must have a back and heels must be no taller than 3 inches. Dress sandals with a back are permissible. Slides will not be allowed.
- Visible tattoos must not be offensive or feature gang related material.
- Ear piercings, tongue piercings, and nostril studs are permitted. All other visible facial/ear piercings are not allowed. This list includes but is not limited to lip rings/studs, nose rings, septum (bull ring), eyebrow, gauges, plugs, and tapers.

-Principal/Assistant Principal has final say

** If the principal determines that a student's grooming or clothing violates the school's dress code, the student will be given an opportunity to correct the problem at school. If not corrected, the student may be assigned to in-school suspension for the remainder of the day, until the problem is corrected, or until a parent or designee brings an acceptable change of clothing to the school. Repeated offenses may result in the student being placed in standardized dress or other disciplinary action in accordance with the Student Code of Conduct.
