How can I help my child succeed in school??

Teachers assign homework for some very good reasons. Here are some...

1) To review and practice what was learned in the classroom 2) To preview and prepare for the next lesson 3) To develop a student's work habits 4) To learn how to use other resources, such as the internet, reference books, interviews, etc., to learn 5) To teach independence 6) To help the student develop self-discipline and responsibility 7) To help parents know what is going on in the classroom.



HOW CAN I HELP??






One of the best things that can be done to help your child get the most out of their homework is for you as a parent to be supportive and show the student that YOU think their homework is important. Here are some other tips for success....

Set a specific, regular homework time every day.

- Find a place that is as free from distractions as possible.
- Build in frequent, but short, breaks into homework time.
- If it will help, use a timer to help the student monitor their study time.




Make sure you have all the needed materials.



- Set aside a set of homework materials (pencils, paper, crayons, ruler, etc.)
- Keep all the homework supplies in a specific box or container that the student can get to.
- Be sure the supplies are replaced when they run low.

Keep track of assignments

- Make sure that your child gets started and is continuing to work on their assignments.
- * Check the work to see that it is completed.
- Even if you are not sure of the RIGHT answers, look to see that their answers make sense.
- Read any teacher comments on returned homework.



OTHER TIPS....

- * Get your student a folder or planner that they use for daily homework.
- * Go through this planner/folder every day.
- * Be on the lookout for messages, notes, or other correspondence from the teacher.
- * Ask your child what they learned in school that day.
- * DON'T ACCEPT "NOTHING" OR "I DON'T KNOW" AS AN ANSWER!!!

Contacting the Teacher

- Your child's teacher is here to assist both them and you.
- If you or your child is having any kind of problems, contact the teacher.
- The teacher WANTS your child to be successful!!!



When to contact the teacher...

- * If the instructions on the assignment are not clear.
- * If you are struggling in trying to help your child get organized.
- * If you are unable to provide needed materials.
- * If the assignments are consistently too hard or too easy.
- If your child missed school and needs to make up assignments.
