Performance Goal I: The percentage of students who score Level 2 or higher on the Algebra I EOC assessment will increase from 67.4% in 2017 to 77% in 2023.

Performance Goal II: The percentage of students who score Level 3 or higher on the Algebra I EOC assessment will increase from 23.6% in 2017 to 38.1% in 2023.

Performance Goal III: The percentage of students who score Level 2 or higher on the English II EOC assessment will increase from 62.8% in 2017 to 99% in 2023

Performance Goal IV: The percentage of students who score Level 3 or higher on the English II EOC assessment will increase from 37.8% in 2017 to 78% in 2023.

Performance Goal V: The percentage of students who score Level 2 or higher on the Biology EOC assessment will increase from 67.1% in 2017 to 76% in 2023.

Performance Goal IX: The percentage of students who graduate with a high school diploma with their class will increase from 88.8% in 2017 to 98% in 2023.



Performance Goal XI: The percentage of students satisfied with the learning environment will increase from an average of 68.8% in 2017 to 95% in 2023.


Performance Goal XII: The percentage of students satisfied with the social and physical environment will increase from 72% in 2017 to 94% in 2023

2020-2021 & 2021-2022 Awards & Accomplishments

- Scholarship money awarded to seniors totaled \$3,534,282.
- Of 173 graduates, 94 graduates received completer certificates from the Newberry County Career Center, 42 graduates earned a Newberry County Advanced Diploma, 18 graduates were named as Newberry County School District Honor Graduates, 6 graduates earned the South Carolina Academic Honors Award, 22 graduates were inducted into the National Technical Honor Society, graduates earned a total of 568 dual credit hours for transfer credit towards college degrees, 12 Palmetto Fellows recipients earned a potential scholarship total of \$350,400 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree, 52 students earned a 3.0 or better and ranked in the top 30% of their class with a potential LIFE scholarship total of \$1,040,000 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree, and 138 students met the 3.0 requirement that qualifies a student for the HOPE scholarship with a potential HOPE scholarship total of \$1,545,600 towards a four year Bachelor's Degree.
- An administrator earned his Project Based Learning Endorsement with the S.C. Department of Education in Curriculum and Instruction after completing three graduate courses with the College of Charleston.
- The golf team won the Region 4-AAA Golf Tournament. One player won Region Girls Soccer Player of the Year. Three players won All-Region. They finished 8th in the state at the State Golf Tournament.
- The softball team won the Region 4-AAA Softball Championship. Three players made the AAA All-State Softball Team.
 Two players made the 4A/3A North-South Softball All-Star
 Team. The head varsity softball coach was named Varsity Softball Coach of the Year and North-South All-Star Softball Coach.
- The varsity girls' soccer team won the Region 4-AAA Girls Soccer Championship. One player won Region Player of the Year. Five players were named Region 4-AAA All-Region Girls Soccer Players. The varsity girls' soccer coach earned his 250th career win during the 2021 girls' soccer season.
- The 2020-2021 MCHS girls' soccer team earned the United Soccer Coaches Team Academic Award for exemplary performance in the classroom as a team during the 2020-2021 academic year.
- The varsity boys' soccer team won the Region 4-AAA Boys Soccer Championship.
- The boys' tennis team won the Region 4-AAA Boys Tennis Championship.
- The girls' track team won the Region 4-AAA Track and Field Championship. The boys' track team placed 3rd in the Region 4-AAA Championship. One track team member won the 3A Javelin State Championship. One track team member finished as the state runner-up in the 100-meter hurdles and 4th in the 400 hurdles at the state meet. One track member finished 6th in the 1600 member run at the state meet.
